

* This is the first time outs / scores are recorded but the kids are still learning the game



• Player / Team numbers start to drop here so teams are reduced

 As a result, interleague play becomes necessary, so we aren't playing the same team 4 times per season

- This gives players an opportunity to "travel" to play other local outside leagues – Mason / Lebanon / Anderson, etc..
- Full kid pitch Little League rules will apply

 Typically, one team per age group and sometimes age groups need to combine based on registration numbers






