MARCUS GARVEY PARK ACROPOLIS IS OPEN – A Public Art project opened in Marcus Garvey Park. The work, entitled "Caesura" is located on the Acropolis and involves both an architectural sculpture and sound installation. The installation is open through October 31.

To access the Acropolis use the stairs: (1) near 120th Street & Fifth Avenue, (2) on the Madison Avenue side of the park near the basketball courts or (3) the stairs and walkway behind the amphitheater. All paths and staircases leading up to the Acropolis are open. This is the first public art installation on the Acropolis.
