HLL Remembers Anthony (Tony) L. Spencer, Sr. This true son of Harlem passed away on May 15, 2014 after a long illness. In his memory, Tony's family sponsors an AAA team - "the Harlem Express". Next Saturday, May 16, before the 10 AM game at Rucker Field there will be a brief memorial tribute. An original member of Harlem LL's Board of Directors, Tony served until his death. He also served as a manager and eventually recruited his son, Anthony, to coach with him; together they worked magic in the AAA Division.

Tony served as Commander of the 369th Transportation Battalion, the Black unit known as the "Harlem Hell fighters" who fought with the French in World War I due to the USA's segregation

of black and white troops at the time. While fighting with the French, the unit was awarded the Croix de Guerre for fighting so valiantly.

One of the company's battalions, the 719th Transportation Company, is known as the "Harlem Express." Tony served as platoon leader for this company that took such pride in their work, operated as a team and always got the job done accurately and on time. It was known that you could count on the "Harlem Express." The family believes Tony would be proud to be remembered in this way and is rooting Go Harlem Express!!
