- Law 1 - The Field of Play
- Spectators should be at least 1 yard off the touchlines (sidelines)
- Goals are placed in the center of the goal line (end line).
- Corner flags are not used in these leagues.
- A referee will not schedule for the game
- 1 coach from each team will act as the referee per field.
- If another coach is not available, ask a parent to help.
- On a goal kick the opposing team will start on their own half of the field until the ball is in play.
- Definition of ball in play is clear movement of the ball. This movement does not need to be forward motion.
- Law 2 - The Ball
- Games are played with a size three (3) ball.
- The team that offers a ball to use will be the home team. The other team will be away and get kick off first
- Law 3 - Number of Players
- A match is played by two teams, each consisting of not more than four (4) players.
- Coach will send four (4) players to each field for the quarter.
- Substitutions: Occur at the quarters.
- Equal Playing Time: equal playing time is expected.
- Law 4 - Players' Equipment
- Players should wear this season's team uniform. If a player does not have their official uniform, use a practice jersey or similar color shirt is permissible with the agreement of the coaches.
- It is encouraged to wear the issued socks but not required.
- Soccer cleats are not required.
- Metal cleats, baseball cleats, or football cleats with a center front stud are not permitted.
- Shin guards MUST be word and COVERED COMPLETELY with the soccer sock.
- Players may not play with a hard cast or brace unless it is covered with bubble wrap and secured with tape.
- If the wrap becomes undone during the game, treat it as an injury and substitute the player until the wrap is secured.
- Ask the field commissioner if you have questions or want it checked.
- Jewelry of ANY KIND is NOT ALLOWED.
- In Pre-K and Kindergarten leagues ONLY. Newly pierced earring can be covered with tape and have a cotton around the post.
- The goal is to keep every player safe during the game.
- Law 5 -The Referee

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- Not applicate
- Law 6 -Assistant Referee
- Not applicate
- Law 7 -Duration of the Match
- The first 15 minutes are used as a practice, where each team uses one of the two fields.
- The match will be divided into 4 quarters. Each quarter will be eight (8) minutes.
- There shall be a quarter-time or half-time interval of no more than three (3) minutes.
- Keep one game clock for both games to prevent uneven games.
- Clock in Running. No stoppage time.
- Water breaks are allowed if the temperature is over 85 degrees. It will occur around mid-quarter at a natural stoppage of play.
- Coaches should agree prior to the game starting
- Law 8 -Start and Restart of Play
- Conform to FIFA
- Exception is when the restart is a goal kick. The opposing team will start on their own half of the field until the ball is in play.
- Law 9 -Ball In and Out of Play
- Conform to FIFA.
- When the ball COMPLETELY leaves the field across the sideline or goal line. Lines are a part of the field.
- Law $\mathbf{1 0 - M e t h o d ~ o f ~ S c o r i n g ~}$
- No score is kept at this age level.
- Coaches and parents are the key role models to teach the players how to win and lose with grace and respect.
- Law 11 -Offside
- None.
- Law 12 -Fouls and Misconduct
- Conform to FIFA
- NO slide tackles
- NO intentional headers.
- If a player heads the ball intentionally, the opposing team is awarded an indirect free kick.
- A handball occurs when a player touches the ball with their hand or arm either with intent or with their arm in an unnatural playing position. If a ball strikes a hand or arm inadvertently and the arm is in a natural position, no violation has occurred.
- If a player demonstrates poor sportsmanship or persistent dangerous fouling, talk to the player about sportsmanship or dangerous play.

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- If it continues talk with the parents and/or have the player sit for a quarter
- The goal is keep all players safe and create a positive environment
- Law 13 -Free Kicks
- Conform to FIFA
- Exception is that all restarts are indirect free kicks.
- Law 14 -Penalty Kick
- None.
- Law 15 -Throw-In
- When the ball COMPLETELY leaves the field across the touchline (sideline), the team that did not touch it last will resume play via a throw-in.
- The ball must be thrown in with two hands over the head, and both feet must remain on the ground. Both hands must be on the sides of the ball.
- If an illegal throw-in occurs, the infringing player may try again.
- On any throw-in, no defending player may stand within 2 yards of the thrower.
- Kick-ins are also allowed in these leagues
- Law 16 -Goal Kick
- When the ball leaves the field across the goal line (end line) and is last touched by the attacking team, play will resume via a Goal Kick.
- The ball may be kicked in from anywhere in or on the small goal box. (2 yards from the goal line)
- The ball does not need to leave the penalty box before being touched.
- The opposing team must be on their own half of the field


## - Law 17 -Corner Kicks

- When the ball leaves the field across the goal line (end line) and is last touched by the defending team, play will resume via a corner kick.
- All players from the defending team must be at least 4 yards away from the ball.

## Additional Recommendations

- Parents/coaches, non-participating players and spectators should be there to enjoy and encourage the activity of the players from both teams.
- Player skills, not high scoring one sided wins are the objective at this league.
- Please try to control excessive scoring by balancing the team.
- Equal playing time is expected for all kids, this is the number 1 rule.
- All coaches should work together to ensure the games run smoothly.
- At the end of the game please clear the fields in a timely manner as there might be a game afterwards.
