Guidelines for Sanctioning New A-teams SLGSA – 2010-2011

- 1.) Candidate Coach must have 2 seasons as fast pitch coach or assistant coach.
- 2.) Candidate Coach must have 2 seasons involved with SLGSA ALLSTAR/"A" team play either as Head Coach or Assistant.
- 3.) Other associations All-Star or "A" team coaching experience will be considered.
- 4.) Head Coach must sign copy of rules & guidelines for A-Teams and understand consequences for breaking these rules. Coach must communicate the rules and consequences to all parents on the team.
- 5.) Coach must present a roster of at least 9 girls committed to play on team. Complete with parent signatures of commitment. The following Age group must contain a certain amount of girls from Sugar Land or District (43) on their roster at all times

10U - 6

12U - 4

14U - 3

16U - 2

18U & Gold- the Association encourages team managers to carry players who reside in Fort Bend County.

- 6.) Coach must present any assistant coaches and communicate to assistant coach's rules and expectations of the league.
- 7.) Coach should have a reputation of being of good character, of being team oriented with good communication skills.
- 8.) New "A" teams will be added in a division as long as the SLGSA board of directors feels it is not detrimental to that age division in the league.
- 9.) Request for sanction with SLGSA does not guarantee that the request will be approved. All sanction requests are subject to SLGSA Board of Directors vote at the July 19, 2011 meeting. Request for Sanctioning must be received by July 12, 2011.
- 10.) Coach must appear before SLGSA Board of Directors at the August meeting. The current SLGSA President will notify coach of time and date.
- 11.) Coach will not recruit league players after league has formed and further, coach will not recruit other select team players after teams have been formed. If it is determined that this is or has occurred, coach could lose sanction.
- 12.) Send all request to current A Team commissioner by requested date.
