DeKalb County Health Department and AYSO 718 policy is that your child **must stay home** (all three requirements **MUST** be met):

1. for at least 14 calendar days from onset of symptoms, **AND**
2. for 24 hours with no fever (without fever-reducing medication) **AND**
3. improvement of symptoms

HOWEVER, your child may return to soccer in fewer than 14 days if the following is received and confirmed by Kristin Perez, Safety Coordinator or Kevin Toedter, Regional Commissioner.

- Verified medical documentation, stating an alternate diagnosis for symptoms **AND** that there is no suspected COVID-19 infection **AND/OR**
- Documentation of a negative COVID-19 PCR test with today's date or later **AND** improvement of symptoms

If there is no documentation of alternative diagnosis or negative COVID-10 PCR test, earliest return date for symptomatic child is _____

Other children residing in the household also will be required to stay home and return to play on a specified date which will be determined and discussed with you by Kristin Perez, RN or Kevin Toedter.

Medical evaluation and testing are strongly recommended for **ALL** persons with COVID-like symptoms. Please contact your child's licensed healthcare provider, and follow his/her specific guidelines regarding medical treatment/testing. All results should be communicated with the Safety Coordinator and/or Regional Commissioner.

Please Note: In accordance with state and local laws and regulations, organizations are required to notify the local health department of any case of COVID-19, while maintaining confidentiality. Please contact the Safety Coordinator or Regional Commissioner if your child or another family member has tested positive for COVID-19 or has been in close contact with an individual who has tested positive for COVID-19. If your child has a positive COVID-19 test, he or she should remain at home and wait for guidance from your local health department.
