

Referee Certifications

- **8U** On-line course
- Regional On-line Companion Course plus 3 hour in person practical or 8 hour in person course
- Intermediate 8 hour two-day course. Assessment on a 12U Boys game by a registered Area 1C Assessor.
- Advanced Two 8 hour day course, plus physical agility test. Two
 Assessments on a 14U Boys game by a registered Area 1C Assessor as an Assistant Referee and as the Referee.
- National Two 8 hour day course, plus physical agility test. Assessments on a 16U Boys game by a registered Outside Area 1C Assessor as an Assistant Referee and twice as the Referee.

Managing the Game

 The main goals for managing an AYSO game are to ensure player safety and development, promote good sportsmanship, and provide a fun experience for everyone, rather than focusing solely on winning or losing. Key goals include maximizing ball contact and player involvement, preventing "blowouts" to keep the game competitive and educational, keeping players engaged, and developing skills by encouraging mistakes as learning opportunities.

Game Management

Team Check-In

- Inspect Footwear. Soccer Cleats Only
- NO baseball cleats or sneakers allowed.
- NO Shin Guards = No Play must be standard shin guards
- NO Bracelets, Watches, Necklaces, Jewelry & Sunglasses
- NO hoodies under uniform shirt
- Only prescription glasses or sports goggles
- Beads in Hair for Girls okay

Halftime

- Referees meet at Center Circle
- Verify game score and share observations

End of Game

- Referees meet at Center Circle complete game card
- Observe hand-shake between teams Referee on one side both AR's on other side

The Referee

- A Referee's authority extends to everyone at the field, including players, coaches, team officials, spectators, and even assistant referees
- Referees have the final say during, before and after the game. We recommend every coach to become a referee, your perspective will change once you do both.
- Discuss any issues with the referee after the game. Step aside from your parents and players and discuss the issue.
- Heckling will not be tolerated period. NO EXCUSES. Coaches can be cautioned.
- Youth Referees will wear the Blue Jersey so they can be easily identified. Zero Tolerance towards Youth Refs. If not, spectators would be escorted from game.

Team Referee Responsibilities

- Your team is responsible for refereeing the assignment after your game on the same field
 - · A little different for 10U Games. Assistant Referees will referee their own game
- If you are the last game of the day, you will do the first game on the same field
- Sign-up for game(s) in CGI by Wednesday night
- Make sure you sign-up for your game
 - If you can't and need to do another game please communicate with your DC & RRA & ARRA.
 - If you want to Referee or AR for more than 1 game, please feel free to do so
- Calls will be made Thursday night, if there are open slots
- Possible game forfeits will be known by Friday night





CGI (Sign-Up for Game)






Basic Referee Calls


- Use Voice to control and Whistle when required
- Headers ONLY allowed in 14U or older
- Headers NOT ALLOWED 12U and under
- Drop Ball Procedure: Dropped for only one player.
 - All other players of both teams must be 4.5 yards away.
- Cautions & Send Offs can be given to Players in:
 - 10U (Don't show Card to Player)
 - 12U & 14U
- Safety of the players is paramount
- Are mistakes going to happen? Yes, but don't let it get to you

Handball

- Different guidelines suggest when handball should and should not be called.
- Handball will be called when a player gains possession or control of the ball
 after it touches their arm, and a goal is scored, or a goal-scoring opportunity
 arises even if the handball is accidental.
- Handball will generally be called if the hands are up or out/away from the body or above the shoulder.
- Handball will usually not be called if the hand/arm is close to the body or if the player plays the ball and it then rebounds up and hits their arm.




AR flag signals



End of Game


- Watch for Good Sportsmanship during end of game Handshake

New Laws for 2025

- Law 3 The Players
 - 1 Captain only allowed to interact with Referee
- Law 4 The Players' Equipment
 - 1 Requirement for the team captain to wear an identifying armband.
 - 2 Clarification that players are responsible for the size and suitability of their Shin guards
- Law 12 Fouls and Misconduct
 - 1 Clarification that non-deliberate handball offenses for which penalties are awarded are to be sanctioned in the same way as other fouls which are an attempt to play the ball or a challenge for the ball.

The referee is discouraged from displaying a card to 10U players. The referee should approach the offending player's coach, explain the misconduct to the coach while showing the coach you are recording the misconduct on your match report. The misconduct should also be recorded on the back of the game card and a misconduct form completed as required by the competition authorities.

New Laws for 2025

Law 14: The Penalty Kick

- Part of the ball must touch or overhang the center of the penalty mark
- Encroachment by players will be penalized only if it has an impact (same philosophy as goalkeeper encroachment)

New Goalkeeper rule

A goalkeeper holding the ball with their hands or arms for more than eight seconds after gaining control will be penalized with a corner kick to the opposing team. The referee will provide a five-second warning with a visual countdown using their raised hand to indicate the remaining time. This rule aims to reduce time-wasting and improve the pace of the game.

Referee Abuse Prevention

Policy 531-9 Penalty overview / Youth & Amateur

Referees are essential to the game and deserve to be treated with respect. We are all responsible for helping kids have fun playing soccer, and taking anger out on referees negatively impacts everyone and the future of soccer. As a result, US Soccer recently rolled out significant new sanctions for disrespect of Referees (U.S. Soccer Policy 531-9 Misconduct Toward Game Officials in Amateur Matches). AYSO has adopted this policy and outlined the standards of behavior of coaches, players, and spectators towards referees in accordance with this new policy. See Resources below for links.

Key Principles:

- Respect the Call: The call on the field stands.
- Protecting Our Referees: We are committed to ensuring the emotional and physical well-being of our referees.
- No Physical Abuse: There is never a reason to touch a referee outside of friendly handshakes.

Levels of Unacceptable Behavior:

The following outlines different levels of offenses against referees, as described in the sources:

- LEVEL 1: VERBAL TAUNTING: This includes insulting, belittling, insinuating, or taunting behavior that undermines referee authority.
- LEVEL 2: HARASSMENT/INTIMIDATION: This includes harassment, intimidation, retaliation, abusive or threatening language.
- LEVEL 3: THREATS/DEROGATORY LANGUAGE: This involves aggression, attacking, derogatory, cyberbullying, doxing, or threatening (physical/violence) language.
- LEVEL 4: OFFENSIVE OR DISCRIMINATORY ACT: This includes discriminatory or derogatory words or actions based on race, skin color, ethnicity, nationality, social origin, gender, disability, sexual orientation, language, or religion. PHYSICAL ABUSE: There is never a reason to touch a referee outside of friendly handshakes.



REFEREE ABUSE PREVENTION

POLICY 531-9 PENALTY OVERVIEW / YOUTH & AMATEUR

The Penalties Matrix defines consequences associated with physical and non-physical offenses against Referees.

NON-PHYSICAL OFFENSES of gross misconduct, abuse, and / or assault

| Pushing, Grabbing, Pulling, Squeezing, Pinching, Lightly Slapping, Use of Object in Non Striking Manner, or Physical Property Damage | 10 | 6-24 Months |
| Hitting, Punching, Elbowing, Kicking, Biting, Spiting, Choking, Tackling, Throwing or Use of Object or Any Part of Body (Forearm, Knee, Head) in a Striking Manner | | 12 Months - Lifetime |

(*) Discipliner: These are only a few examples of abuse - other actions or statements may also fall into this category.

KEY PENALTY FACTORS

- . Single offenses are at minimum the prescribed game penalty or time penalty for non red zone offenses
- Penalties can be both game and time depending on severity / circumstances
- . Second time offenders receive double punishment
- . Third time offenders receive a lifetime
- . More than one offense at the same time is at least the punishment for the most serious offense
- Offenses against minors are automatically subject to a "minor multiplier" resulting in triple punishment
- One offense warning per league to be managed by states and leagues collaboratively
- . Game consequences are inclusive of 1 game penalty for any red cards given
- . Optionality for 50% penalty for first offense from a minor

To become a Referee Volunteer Requirements

- Register as a Volunteer (5-10 min)
 - Yearly Before Start of Season
 - Required for Youths
- Risk Status (15-20 min)
 - Every Year
 - Not Required for Youths
- Safe Sport
 - Every Year
 - 90 min for first time.
 - 30 minutes every year afterwards
 - Not Required for Youths
- Live Scan
 - Not Required for Youths
- Concussion Awareness (15-20 min)
 - Required for Youths
- Sudden Cardiac Arrest (15-20 min)
 - Required for Youths
- **Safe Haven** (15-20 min)
 - Required for Youths


