





Coaches Are Key

AYSO is built on the power of volunteer support to deliver quality youth soccer programs. Among the many essential volunteer roles, Coaches are key! Players can only play, and teams can only be formed, once coaches are in place. We have over 175 coaches and assistant coaches leading 90 teams, all of which allows nearly 1,000 youth the opportunity to play in Region 60.

We know that playing sports is beneficial for children in terms of physical activity, psychosocial development and learning new skills. Another great benefit of sports is having a dedicated coach that is invested in the positive development of children, both on and off the field. Coaches have many roles, and teaching the sport is just a fraction of their responsibilities. For many players a coach will serve as an advisor, mentor, motivator, role model, or simply a person who listens to them. For parents, a coach is not only the leader of their team. They are also the main liaison between AYSO's leadership and have a key role in communicating decisions that affect everyone. And it doesn't end there. Coaches are also recruiters of other volunteers (e.g. assistant coaches, team managers, referees), researchers, planners, and problem solvers.

Coaches come with a wide array of skills and experience. Some have never played soccer or coached in their lives and are bravely stepping up for the benefit of our children (and

Please Leave Your Pets at Home



AYSO is obligated to observe and respect existing regulations and laws regarding the presence of service animals at our fields. Service animals are defined by the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) as only dogs or miniature horses that have been trained to do work or perform tasks for the benefit of an individual with a disability. Other animals, whether wild or domestic, do not qualify as service animals.

You may have noticed that the City of Alhambra recently changed its position on dogs in Almansor Park. City staff has told the *Touchline* that dogs are allowed in Almansor Park if they are leashed.

However, the City has not changed their permit forms. Our permits for use of Alhambra parks state "No petting zoos or animals of any kind are allowed in Alhambra parks. This includes dogs or any pets on leashes; service animals are exempt." "Any violation of the above regulations shall render the reservation and permission for the use of park and facilities approval null and void and the person or group permitted the use of the park shall upon notice by city staff, cease use of the park and its facilities. Additionally, such holder may be subject to applicable penalties for violation."

We ask all parents, guests and spectators to please leave your pets at home when you attend any AYSO event including practices, games, picture day, closing ceremonies, tournaments, etc. We appreciate your cooperation.
