# Rules and Protocols of Behavior

AYSO has one of the most comprehensive programs governing conduct and behavior

- Background check
- ID check
- Safety classes
- Job specific training

Misconduct is taken seriously

See something, say something – obligation to report

Personal data, images, social media

Not just other AYSO participants

Respect



# Rules and Protocols of Behavior

COMPLETE CERTIFICATIONS AND CLASS TRAINING AS SOON AS POSSIBLE

## **CHILD SAFETY**

- Children only with AYSO verified volunteers
- No child left unattended
- Important: Have registered Team Manager of same gender as players if no coaches are the same gender

## **MEETING WITH PARENTS (CAN BRING KIDS)**

- Pick a date and location as soon as you get rosters
- Recommend holding after first practice, a park, etc.

#### **SET THE TONE & EXPECTATIONS**

What do parents expect from you and what do you expect from parents?

Your expectations should include:

- Improve the kids as players
- Exhibit sportsmanship (players, parents and coaches)
- HAVE FUN (want kids to play in the future)

Convey importance of a positive attitude (i.e., parents can only say things positive and in the past tense)

Remind them they need sit on your team's side of field!

# **ALL NEED TO VOLUNTEER (100% VOLUNTEERS)**

Coaches already are making a huge commitment, you do not and should not need to do more – over-reach negatively impacts your coaching

- Team Manager (A CERTIFIED POSITION)
- Referee
- Ad hoc roles (field set up/take down)

Uniforms are not handed out until team volunteer roles are filled in by the TM, sponsor check is in, and all certifications completed

# CALABASAS ON RANGE

# **GIVE CLEAR, SPECIFIC EXPECTATIONS AND DETAILS (SUCH AS):**

- Kids arrive early or on time to the training ground
- Kids have water with name, shin guards under soccer socks, sunscreened, cleats on and tied, restrooms visited, etc.
- Contact team staff if going to be late
- Prior notice required if missing training or a game
- Pick up players promptly after practice
- AYSO volunteers (coaches, team manager) are responsible for child safety – no child left after practice

#### **INFORM SO THERE'S NO EXCUSES**

#### Wow, Soccer is Fun!

- FAST closing speed "Cheetah Speed!"
- Recognize when the ball is behind you to recover FAST

- Cheetah speed and then slow down

#### All about the BALL **6U**

#### Wow, Soccer is Fun!

- Learn to keep the ball close while dribbling.
- Turn with the ball while dribbling to get around opponents.
- Make contact with the ball to shoot.

#### Year of the Dribble

- Identify diamond team shape.
- Stay far enough away from teammate to not crowd their dribble.
- Turn away from pressure when dribbling.
- Execute controlled dribbling engaging the opponent with

## BE KIND. BE RESPECTFUL.

- Referees run the matches
- "Red Shirts" have final say in all matters
- Very low tolerance for misconduct
- Zero tolerance for youth referee abuse
- Your job to demonstrate
- Game Cards you team manager will have them

#### PLEASE PROTECT GOALKEEPERS

A Goalkeeper in AYSO is considered to have "possession" of ball with one finger on ball. This does <u>not</u> mean that a Goalkeeper cannot commit a foul. Teach kids to NOT recklessly challenge balls near Goalkeepers and reinforce this during practice and games.

# Game Conduct & Sportsmanship

## **6U, 7U, 8U COACHES**

One coach from each team is on the field to monitor play, call directions, halt play for obvious foul or injury – help guide play, be positive and encouraging without cheering


## **TEAM REFEREES (10U, 12U, 14U)**

Each team should have 1-3 registered volunteer referees to work in the region.

- Team referees can be anyone age 12+ who is certified
- Referees self-select matches
- Referees CAN work own team's games in 10U

#### LAWS OF THE GAME

- 10U+ divisions follow FIFA Laws of the Game with some exceptions in 10U (Buildout line, no GK punting)
- Coaches benefit from knowing the Laws (see Referee page on our website)



# **Post Season**

#### **REGULAR SEASON POINTS SYSTEM**

- Match points: Win = 2 pts, Tie = 1 pt.
- Sportsmanship points = 1 pt. per match can be earned

# QUALIFICATION FOR REGIONAL INVITATIONAL TOURAMENT

- Teams need a minimum of 20 points
- Must have team referee(s) worked at least 12 matches (combined) to be eligible for any AYSO post-season play
- Teams cannot advance in tournament without having a referee work at least one playoff game for each round

# **QUALIFICATION FOR AYSO AREA 10E PLAYOFF**

 Division Directors & Commissioners select top teams to compete in Area playoffs in December. All teams must have met the Regional Tournament qualifications.
