

RESPONSIBLE E-BIKE RIDING

Whether in our parks, open space, or around town, please keep our community safe.

What is an E-bike?

California Vehicle Code Section 312.5 defines an e-bike as:

An "electric bicycle" is a bicycle equipped with fully operable pedals and an electric motor of less than 750 watts.





A "Class 1 electric bicycle" is a bicycle equipped with a motor that provides assistance only when the rider is pedaling, and that ceases to provide assistance when the bicycle reaches the speed of 20 miles per hour.

ALLOWED

The only electric vehicles on COSCA open space are Class 1 e-bikes and certain mobility devices for those with physical constraints to trail access.

NOT ALLOWED

On park grass areas/turf. Riders will be cited.



A "Class 2 electric bicycle," or "low-speed throttle-assisted electric bicycle," is a bicycle equipped with a motor that may be used exclusively to propel the bicycle, and that is not capable of providing assistance when the bicycle reaches the speed of 20 miles per hour.

STRICTLY PROHIBITED



A "Class 3 electric bicycle" or "speed pedal-assisted electric bicycle," is a bicycle equipped with a motor that provides assistance only when the rider is pedaling, ceases to provide assistance when the bicycle reaches the speed of 28 miles per hour, and is equipped with a speedometer.

STRICTLY PROHIBITED

Prohibited to prevent damage to turf, trails and natural resources, and to ensure public safety on shared multi-use trails and our parks.
