Subject: October 4 matches in Murrieta Hello Redlands RC and company,

My name is Josh Schwarz and I'm the Coach Admin/Coach Instructor here in Murrieta at Region 1463. I wanted to reach out to you all regarding two of your teams that came and played their matches in Murrieta today. I was the center referee for both matches and I can't say enough great things about both of your teams. The first match was your 16UG #2 team. The second match was your 12UBEX team (Coach Martinez).

The 16UG match was at 8:00am and unfortunately our Murrieta team was short on players and played the entire match with only 9 players. Both teams played their hearts out to say the least. Your Redlands girls demonstra<mark>ted</mark> some of the best sportsmanship I may have ever seen in my 10 years at AYSO. There were many instances where the Redlands attackers had a 1v1 with the GK and could have easily 'pushed the envelope' and created a potentially dangerous situation and/or collision with the Murrieta GK, but they didn't. They showed a professional level of restraint and pulled themselves back in order to protect the GK and avoid any sort of collision, injury, or foul. Consistently throughout the match, the Redlands players were checking on their opponents after they fell or got fouled, giving their opponents kudos after a great play or great save, making sure the opponents were back on their feet and ok before getting themselves back in the play, and they all really seemed to be enjoying the game at the same time. There were no shortage of smiles and the teams both demonstrated teamwork that was simply on another level.

Regardless of the score, both teams played their hearts out to the final whistle, and both teams competed with pure class. There were no bad attitudes, no tempers that flared up, and nobody held their head down. After the match, the entire Redlands team awarded the sportsmanship pin to the Murrieta GK and cheered like crazy for her once they learned that it was her FIRST time playing GK ever! I saw the Murrieta GK just absolutely light up and smile with just as big of a smile that a smile could be. She might STILL be smiling if I'm being honest!

The coaches and parents were absolutely stand-out as well, with positive coaching and positive cheering from whistle to whistle. My hat's off to both teams, the coaches, and their parents. It was an honor to be the referee for those girls and I truly hope I get an opportunity to see these teams again and maybe even referee their match again.

RECOGNITION

Immediately after the 16UG match,

I went straight to the 12UBEX match at 10:00am and began the check-in process.

Not realizing at the time that I was refereeing two Redlands teams back-to-back, it was a pleasant surprise considering the extraordinary experience I had just had with your 16UG team. During check-in, I did tell the boys team what an awesome job their older girls just did and I challenged them to be just as good or better.

I certainly was not disappointed. Clearly there is a difference when playing in the EXTRA program compared to core. And once again, my hat's off to Coach Martinez and his players for absolutely setting the standard for what an AYSO EXTRA team should look like. The term 'class act' comes to mind again. Pure professionalism from the players and coaches, and a very competitive and exciting match. Not one player from either team argued or complained about a call, and every single one of those boys played their hearts out. Each team showed exceptional sportsmanship throughout the match and I don't have one single complaint or negative thing to say about either team.

I've been doing this a long time, and I don't think I've ever had such an amazing experience as a referee as I did today with your 2 Redlands teams. Gigantic thanks to you and your teams for that! Teamwork, sportsmanship, positivity, and class were all on full display today from both teams, and I wanted to take a little bit of time to recognize the players, the coaches, and your Region. These coaches and their players all deserve a round of applause and a pat on the back for what they did today. AWESOME JOB REDLANDS!


