 - Regular season games can be scheduled mid-week and/or Saturday (Area W staff will create schedule)



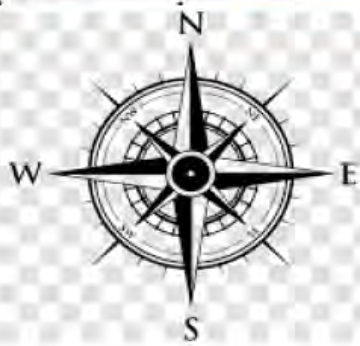
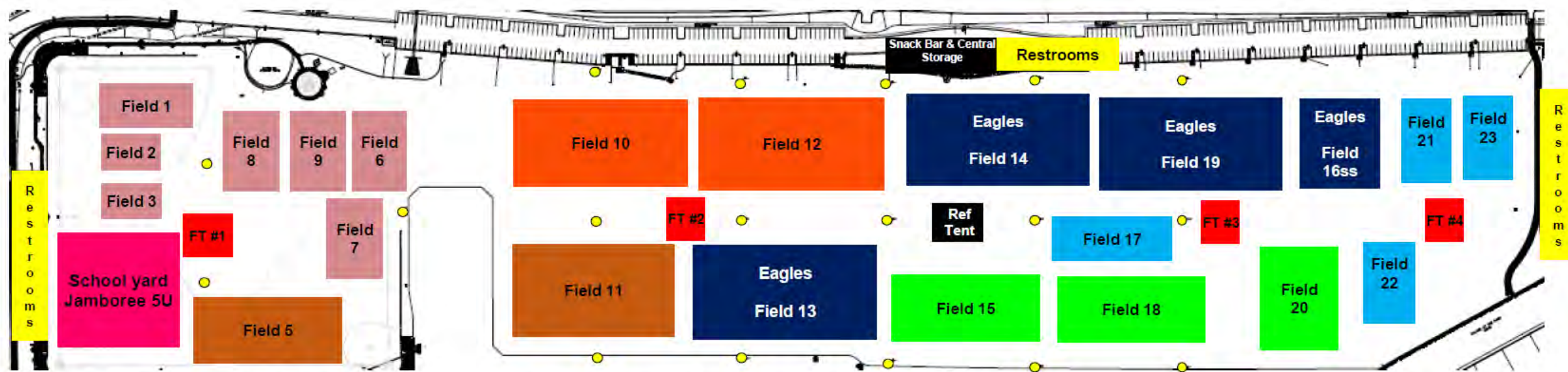

Field Selection Process (Updated)



1. EPIC (formally VIP) to get as much space as possible on PV Field East End
2. Board Member Head Coaches shall email Practice Field Scheduler their request PRIOR to 1st Field Selection Night
3. United Coaches continue with their current practice grid or email Practice Field Scheduler of any changes PRIOR to 1st Field Selection Night
4. 14U, 16U, 19U and coaches with multiple teams shall email Practice Field Scheduler their request 2 days PRIOR to 1st Field Selection Night
 - 16U and 19U teams are NOT allowed 6:00 – 7.30pm practice slots at PV Fields
 - 16U and 19U teams can take any time slot at any other field
5. Field Selection Night (See next slide)

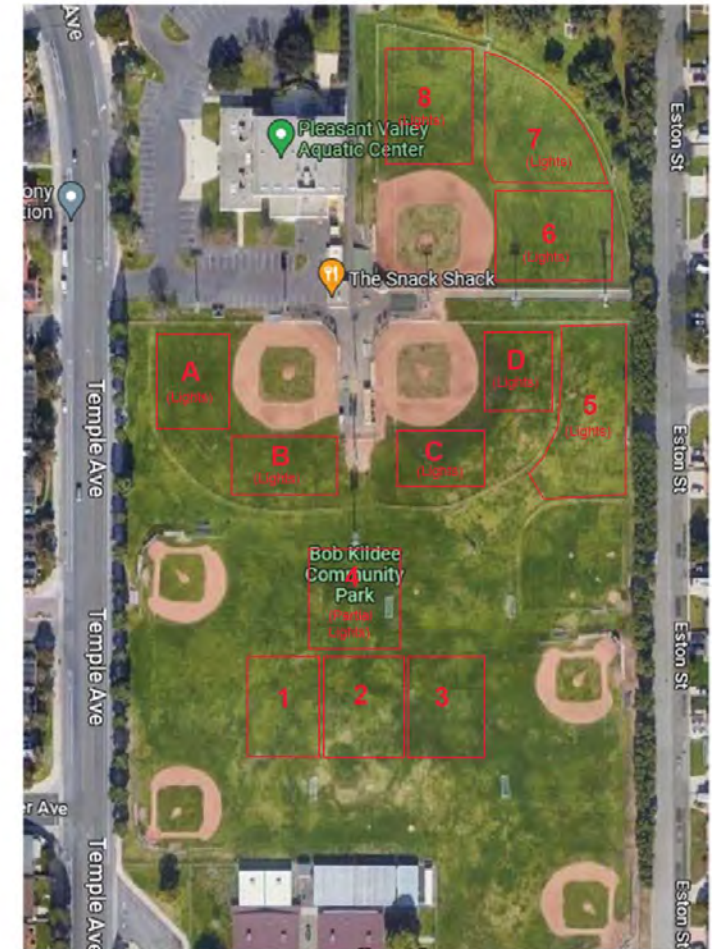
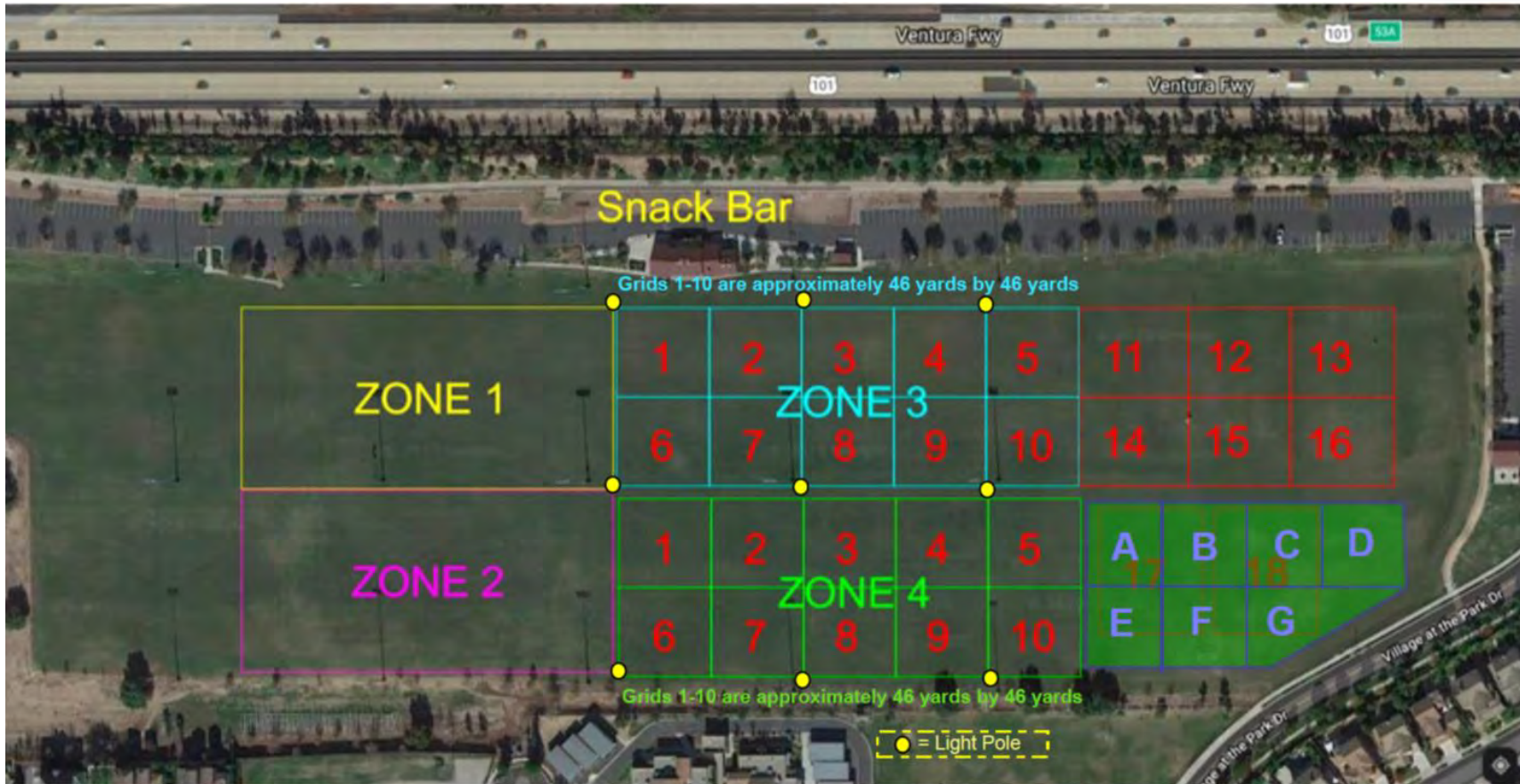

TURF SHOES

Pleasant Valley Fields reflect the high maintenance and care provided by the Park District and the TLC (tender loving care) by the users of the facility.

To support this effort and to preserve our beautiful fields, *the required footwear for practices scheduled at Pleasant Valley Fields is turf shoes or sneakers/tennis shoes* — instead of cleats. Turf shoes at PVF are easier on your feet and easier on our fields.

Coaches who practice at PV Fields must do a shoe check at the beginning of every practice. Any player wearing cleats is not allowed to practice. Players caught wearing cleats during practice will cause the entire team to be removed from practicing at PV Fields for the rest of the season.

Also, if there are wet spots on the field, please avoid the area and do not practice near them.



Turf Shoes are Mandatory

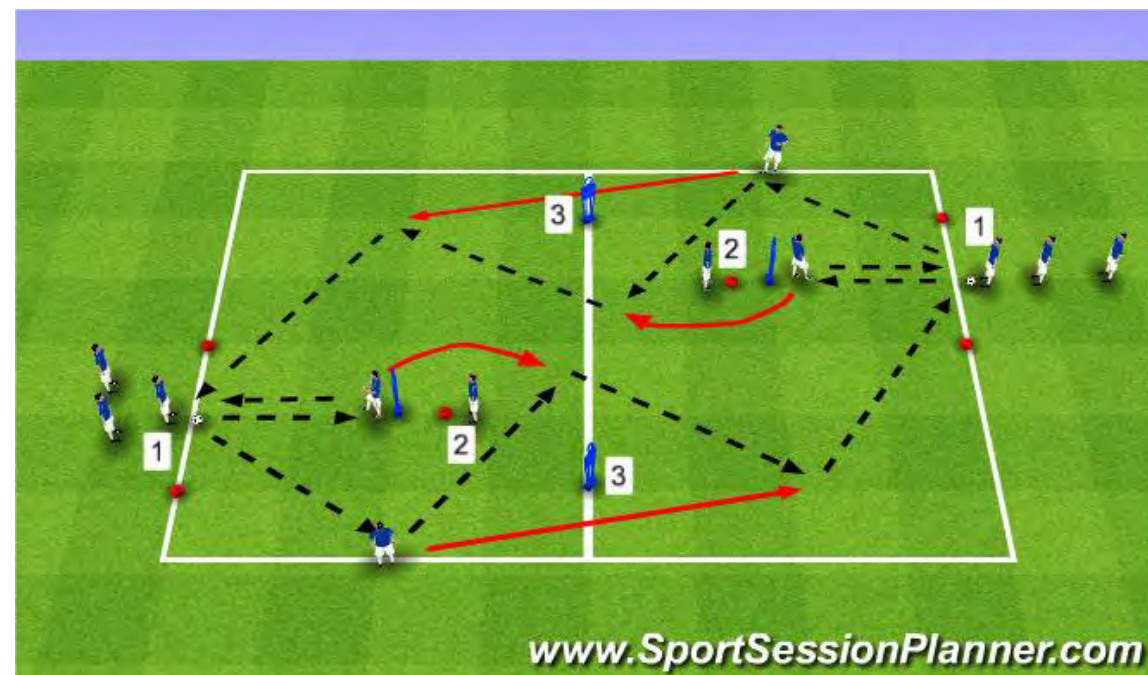

Sportsmanship

- Avoid “Running Up the Score”
 - Generally defined as a point differential of more than 5 goals
 - The responsibility is on the coach, not the referees
 - Game cards will be reviewed and a Warning may be issued for violations
 - Subsequent violations can result in a disciplinary hearing at HQ
- Keep It Fun for BOTH Teams
- Keep It Fun for BOTH Sidelines
- Keep It Fun for BOTH Coaches

“Respect the Call” – New US Soccer Initiative

NON-PHYSICAL ABUSE

- **Level 1: Verbal Taunting** – Minimum two-game suspension (*Examples: offensive, insulting, belittling, insinuating, taunting language*).
- **Level 2: Harassment / Intimidation** – Minimum four-game suspension (*Examples: harassment, intimidation, retaliation, abusive language, non-physical threats*).
- **Level 3: Threats / Derogatory Language** – Minimum six-game and/or 6-12 month suspension (*Examples: aggression, attacking, derogatory, doxing, physical threat, cyber bullying*).
- **Level 4: Offensive or Discriminatory Acts** – Minimum 10-game and/or 12-24 month suspension (*Examples: comments about race, skin color, ethnicity, nationality, social origin, gender, disability, sexual orientation, language, religion*).



“Respect the Call” – New US Soccer Initiative



PHYSICAL ABUSE

- **Level 1: Minor or Slight Touching** – Minimum three-game and/or 1-6 month suspension (*Examples: minor or slight deliberate touching*).
- **Level 2: Physical Confrontation** – Minimum 10-game and/or 6-24 month suspension (*Examples: pushing, grabbing, pulling, squeezing, pinching, slapping, use of object in a non-striking manner, property damage*).
- **Level 3: Violent Contact** – Minimum 12-month suspension to lifetime ban (*Examples: hitting, punching, elbowing, kicking, biting, spitting, choking, tackling, kneeing, headbutting, throwing object in striking manner*).

USSF/AYSO Youth Referee Initiative

Dear Coaches and Spectators,
Our Region is participating in a pilot program being run by US Soccer.

It is your responsibility to Protect Young Referees.

It's about Being Positive Role Models in Sport.

In every sport, we expect that all referees are treated with respect and courtesy. However, we acknowledge that it is particularly crucial to behave appropriately around referees who are children or teenagers. It's often challenging to discern the age of a referee solely by appearance or judging their abilities, which is why we have introduced the **GREEN WHISTLE** as a simple identifier to protect these young officials.

In all sports, we can be positive role models for referees, players, and fans alike. Consider these steps to contribute positively to your sports community:

Youth Referee (Pilot):

- Green Whistle
- Green Armband

- **Acknowledge and Appreciate Referees:** Regardless of the sport, when you see a referee, especially if they're under 18, take a moment to express your appreciation for their efforts. This encourages them to continue and do their best.
- **Cheer Positively:** Create an environment filled with great sportsmanship by cheering for both teams. Positivity on the sidelines contributes to a better sporting atmosphere.
- **Highlight Young Referees:** In all sports, appreciate and highlight the contributions of young referees, officials, and athletes. Your support and acknowledgment go a long way in ensuring they continue to feel valued.
- **Team and Coaching Etiquette:** If you're part of a team or coaching staff, make it a standard practice to thank the referee for their efforts, no matter their age.

- Referee **Abuse** is **extreme** deliberate and non-contact behavior that causes **significant harm**.
- Referee **Assault** is any deliberate **physical** action against a Referee.

Words or gestures that are:

- Insulting
- Belittling
- Insinuating
- Taunting
- Undermining Referee Authority

PENALTY:

2-GAME
MINIMUM SUSPENSION

Non-Physical Abuse

LEVEL 2: HARASSMENT / INTIMIDATION

Language or body language intended to make referee feel unsafe:

- Harassment
- Intimidation
- Retaliation
- Abusive or Threatening (Non-Physical) Language

PENALTY:

4-GAME
MINIMUM SUSPENSION

LEVEL 3: VERBAL TAUNTING

Aggressive language and threats of violence:

- Aggression
- Attacking
- Derogatory
- Cyberbullying
- Doxing
- Threatening (Physical/Violence) Language

PENALTY:

6-GAME AND OR 6-24 MONTHS
MINIMUM SUSPENSION

Physical Abuse

LEVEL 1: MINOR TOUCHING

Minor or Slight Deliberate Touching

PENALTY:
3-GAME AND OR 1-6 MONTHS
MINIMUM SUSPENSION

Physical Abuse

LEVEL 2: INTENTIONAL CONFRONTATION

Using contact to intimidate or provoke a physical confrontation:

- Pushing
- Grabbing
- Pulling
- Squeezing
- Pinching
- Lightly Slapping
- Use of Object in Non-Striking Manner
- Physical Property Damage

PENALTY:
10-GAME AND OR 6-24 MONTHS
MINIMUM SUSPENSION

Physical Abuse

LEVEL 3: VIOLENT CONTACT

Physical contact that is malicious, violent, or intended to cause harm:

- Hitting
- Punching
- Elbowing
- Kicking
- Biting
- Spitting
- Choking
- Tackling
- Throwing or Use of Object or Body Part in a Striking Manner

PENALTY:
12 MONTH UP TO LIFETIME BAN
MINIMUM SUSPENSION

Tips for Coaches

- Always be positive
- Please do not argue with the referee - even when they are wrong
- If you feel a referee is out of hand, send a parent get someone from the referee tent. We can help mentor the referee.
- Remember we are all volunteers

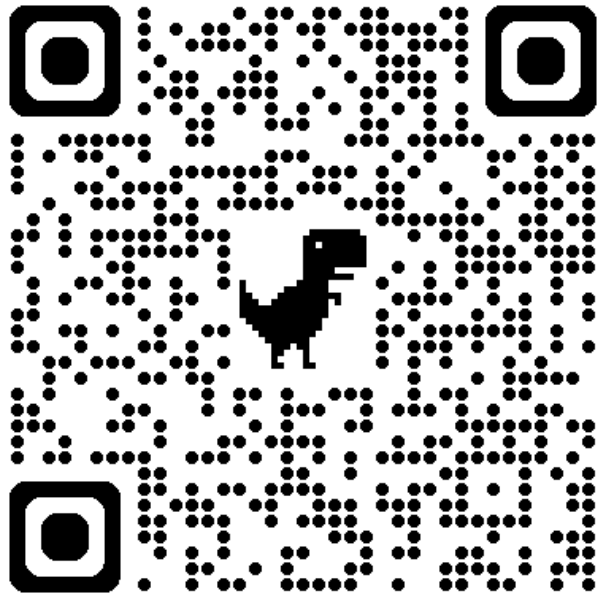

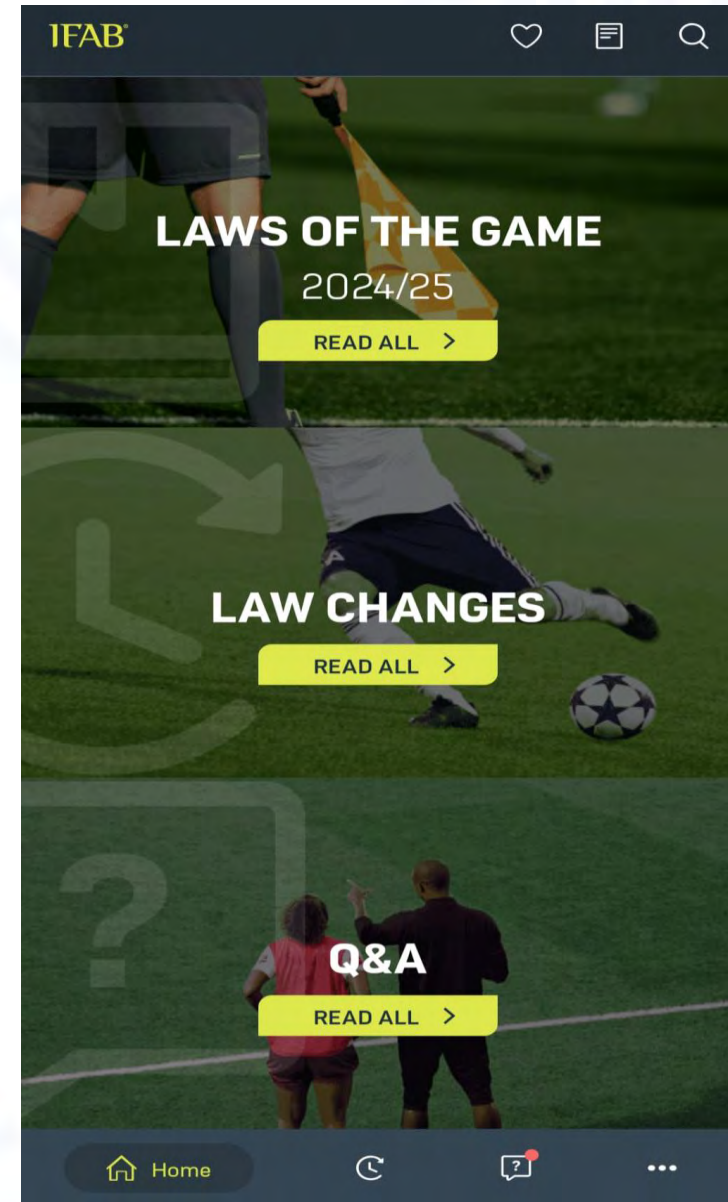

Parent Participation Points

- Non-Competitive Teams 6U & 7U
 - One (1) field assignment for the entire season must be completed to receive your trophies
- Non-Competitive Teams 8U
 - 4 points required (plus team player ratings) to receive your trophies
 - One (1) field assignment for the entire season must be completed
 - Three (3) 10U+ referee assignments during the season



Parent Participation Points

- We Run On Volunteers
- Competitive Teams 10U-19U
 - Combination of Referee and Field Assignments
 - 10U – 17 points
 - 12U – 19 points
 - 14U – 21 points
 - 16U – 3 points / home game
 - 19U – 3 points / home game
 - 4 referee points during Pool Play (weeks 8 – 10)
 - 1 table assignment during Pool Play (weeks 8 – 10)
- Qualifies your team for Championship Day



Parent Participation Points

- Important Note:
 - ***If a non-competitive Team does not meet their Parent Participation Point requirement, the Team will NOT get their trophies***
 - ***8U teams MUST also submit their team player ratings***
 - ***If a competitive Team does not meet their Parent Participation Point requirement nor turn in their team player ratings, that team will not play after week #10. No Championship Day! No Area 10W Playoffs! No Section 10 Playoffs!***



Uniform Distribution

- Head Coach, Assistant Coach, and Team Manager must be registered with a cleared background check before your team gets uniforms
 - Referees will be taken care of by the Referee Staff
- Uniforms, air pump, soccer ball, first-aid kit, other coach swag
 - Varying uniform sizes – please distribute to team in player height order (shortest to tallest)
- Date: August 15th from 6:00pm to 8:00pm



Picture Day Dates



- Please note the following Picture Day Dates
 - Saturday September 13th
 - Saturday September 27th
- Dates assigned by Division. Teams will be assigned a Picture Day date/time that won't conflict with their game schedule
- Detailed Picture Day Schedule will be posted on the website
- Like last year everything will be digital. Look for links sent to each parent
- Please do not request a change to this schedule
 - We have over 1500 player pictures to coordinate and cannot accommodate special requests
- Pictures will be distributed ONLY if Coach, AC and Team Manager have completed all of their safety certifications





Game Day Reminders Non-Comp



- No Goalies
- Please don't camp defenders or "cherry pickers"
- No more than a 5 goal differential
- Remind your team to clear the area when the other team has a goal kick
- U6 & U7 : kick-ins *You can not score from a kick-in
- U8 : New This Year – THROW IN'S! no penalty will be called for a bad throw in
- Our goal is to want the kids to come back next week!



Game Day Reminders



- 3/4 Quarters Play Rule
 - Region 68 enforces that players MUST play a minimum of three quarters per game
 - NO player may sit a SECOND quarter until ALL players have sat out ONE quarter
 - Injuries are the ONLY exception
- Goalies (10U – 14U)
 - During the regular season, a player can play goalie for a MAXIMUM of two quarters (weeks 1 – 7)
 - During Pool Play Playoffs and beyond, a player can play goalie all game (weeks 8+)
- Make sure your game cards are turned in after your game!



Pre-Season Duties



- Contact players by August 4, 2025
 - Practice can start on August 4th

TURF SHOES

Pleasant Valley Fields reflect the high maintenance and care provided by the Park District and the TLC (tender loving care) by the users of the facility.

To support this effort and to preserve our beautiful fields, *the required footwear for practices scheduled at Pleasant Valley Fields is turf shoes or sneakers/tennis shoes* — instead of cleats. Turf shoes at PVF are easier on your feet and easier on our fields.

Coaches who practice at PV Fields must do a shoe check at the beginning of every practice. Any player wearing cleats is not allowed to practice. Players caught wearing cleats during practice will cause the entire team to be removed from practicing at PV Fields for the rest of the season.

Also, if there are wet spots on the field, please avoid the area and do not practice near them.

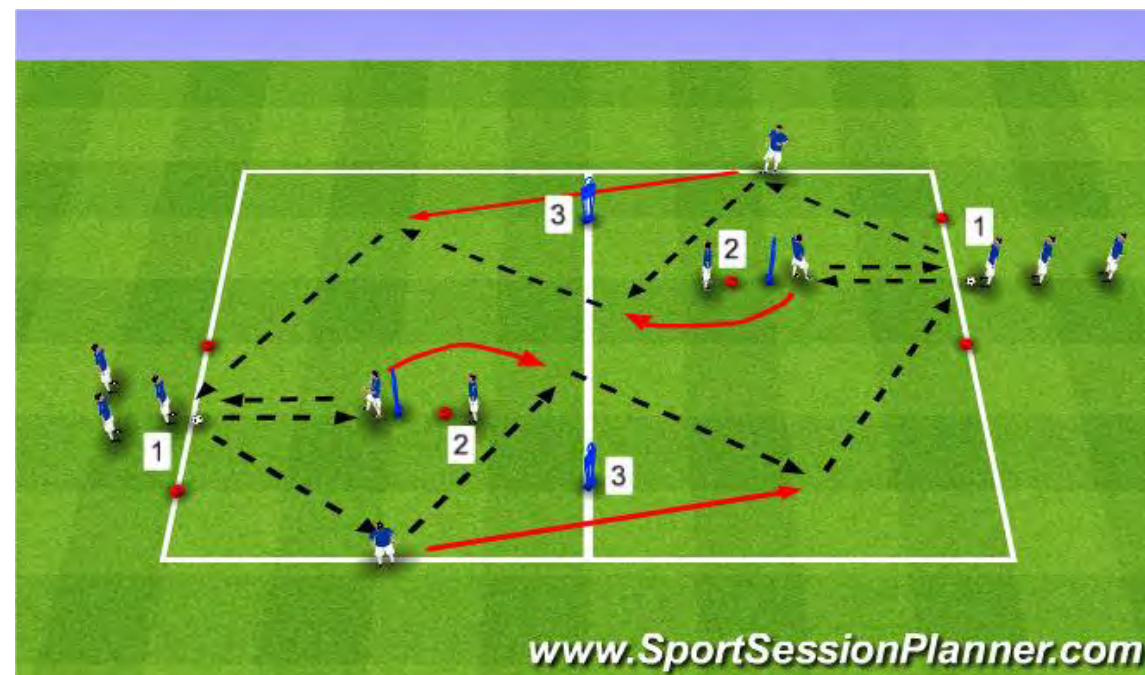

“Respect the Call” – New US Soccer Initiative

NON-PHYSICAL ABUSE

- **Level 1: Verbal Taunting** – Minimum two-game suspension (*Examples: offensive, insulting, belittling, insinuating, taunting language*).
- **Level 2: Harassment / Intimidation** – Minimum four-game suspension (*Examples: harassment, intimidation, retaliation, abusive language, non-physical threats*).
- **Level 3: Threats / Derogatory Language** – Minimum six-game and/or 6-12 month suspension (*Examples: aggression, attacking, derogatory, doxing, physical threat, cyber bullying*).
- **Level 4: Offensive or Discriminatory Acts** – Minimum 10-game and/or 12-24 month suspension (*Examples: comments about race, skin color, ethnicity, nationality, social origin, gender, disability, sexual orientation, language, religion*).

PHYSICAL ABUSE

- **Level 1: Minor or Slight Touching** – Minimum three-game and/or 1-6 month suspension (*Examples: minor or slight deliberate touching*).
- **Level 2: Physical Confrontation** – Minimum 10-game and/or 6-24 month suspension (*Examples: pushing, grabbing, pulling, squeezing, pinching, slapping, use of object in a non-striking manner, property damage*).
- **Level 3: Violent Contact** – Minimum 12-month suspension to lifetime ban (*Examples: hitting, punching, elbowing, kicking, biting, spitting, choking, tackling, kneeing, headbutting, throwing object in striking manner*).

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

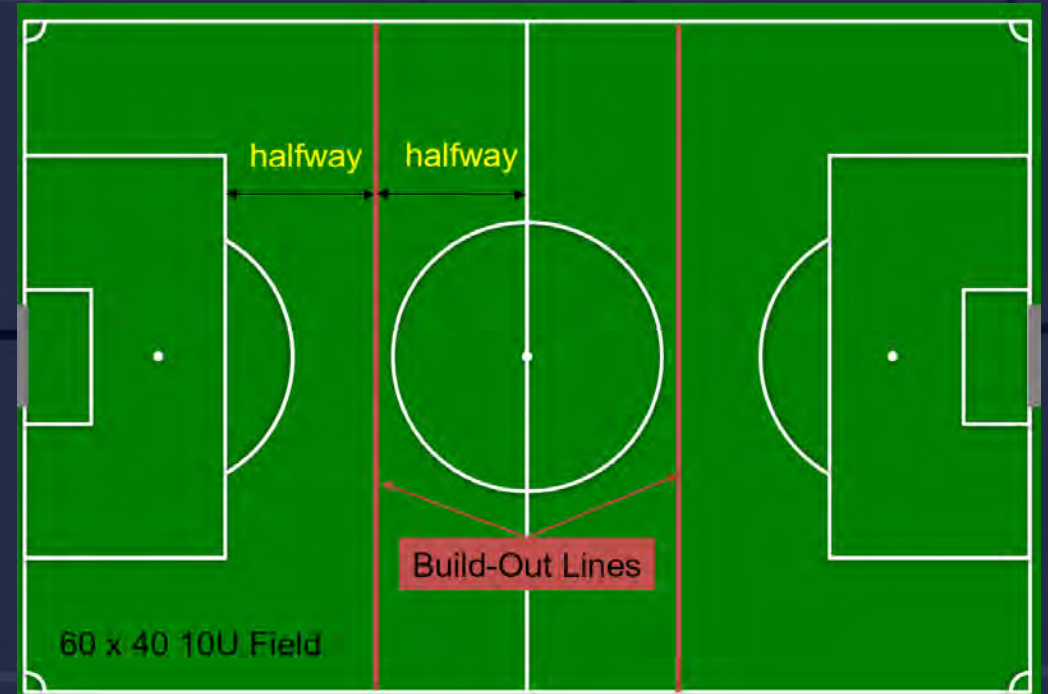
- Simply, without referees the kids don't play soccer
- 430 competitive games, about 40 per week
- Start requesting Referee volunteers on team's very first parent meeting
- 2-3 referees per team is highly recommended
- Most teams need about 2 Participating Points per week.
- 2 max per team per week
- Training, support, mentoring, fun



CAMARILLO AYSO - REFEREE PROGRAM

10 U Divisions Player Development

- Goalkeeper punts NOT allowed
- If Goalkeeper possession, ball is in play when the keeper releases from hands
- If Goal Kick, ball is in possession when kicked
- If opponent crosses BOL before ball is in play; restart is an Indirect Free Kick where the infraction occurred
- Goalkeeper does not need to wait for opponents to cross BOL before distribution
- NO heading
- The BOL replaces the Halfway Line as the boundary where offside infractions are considered. (i.e. no offside infractions between BOLs)



CAMARILLO AYSO - REFEREE PROGRAM

12 U Divisions Player Development

- Deliberate heading is banned
- Goalkeeper punts are allowed
- No BOL in 12U

Youth Referee Program

USSF/AYSO Youth Referee Initiative

Dear Coaches and Spectators,
Our Region is participating in a pilot program being run by US Soccer.

It is your responsibility to Protect Young Referees.

It's about Being Positive Role Models in Sport.

In every sport, we expect that all referees are treated with respect and courtesy. However, we acknowledge that it is particularly crucial to behave appropriately around referees who are children or teenagers. It's often challenging to discern the age of a referee solely by appearance or judging their abilities, which is why we have introduced the **GREEN WHISTLE** as a simple identifier to protect these young officials.

In all sports, we can be positive role models for referees, players, and fans alike. Consider these steps to contribute positively to your sports community:

Youth Referee (Pilot):

- Green Whistle
- Green Armband

- **Acknowledge and Appreciate Referees:** Regardless of the sport, when you see a referee, especially if they're under 18, take a moment to express your appreciation for their efforts. This encourages them to continue and do their best.
- **Cheer Positively:** Create an environment filled with great sportsmanship by cheering for both teams. Positivity on the sidelines contributes to a better sporting atmosphere.
- **Highlight Young Referees:** In all sports, appreciate and highlight the contributions of young referees, officials, and athletes. Your support and acknowledgment go a long way in ensuring they continue to feel valued.
- **Team and Coaching Etiquette:** If you're part of a team or coaching staff, make it a standard practice to thank the referee for their efforts, no matter their age.



Bracelets, Earrings, Necklaces

Law 4: Player's Equipment

Recent Jewelry Trend: permanently "welded" together thus making it non-removable (e.g., bracelets, earrings, necklaces)



Referees should be cognizant of these trends and not allow jewelry to be worn or taped. The player can choose to either remove the item or not play that day and should be encouraged to use removable jewelry during the season. Parents and Program Administrators should be made aware of this at the start of the season to avoid any conflicts on game day.

- Referee **Abuse** is **extreme** deliberate and non-contact behavior that causes **significant harm**.
- Referee **Assault** is any deliberate **physical** action against a Referee.

PHYSICAL ABUSE

10-GAME AND OR 6-24 MONTHS
MINIMUM SUSPENSION

Physical Abuse

LEVEL 3: VIOLENT CONTACT

Physical contact that is malicious, violent, or intended to cause harm:

- Hitting
- Punching
- Elbowing
- Kicking
- Biting
- Spitting
- Choking
- Tackling
- Throwing or Use of Object or Body Part in a Striking Manner

PENALTY:
12 MONTH UP TO LIFETIME BAN
MINIMUM SUSPENSION

Tips for Coaches

- Always be positive
- Please do not argue with the referee - even when they are wrong
- If you feel a referee is out of hand, send a parent get someone from the referee tent. We can help mentor the referee.
- Remember we are all volunteers

Lead by example. Set the tone for good sportsmanship with your players.

Respect your referees, whether you agree with their calls or not.

Cheer for your team, not against the referee. Help create a positive environment.

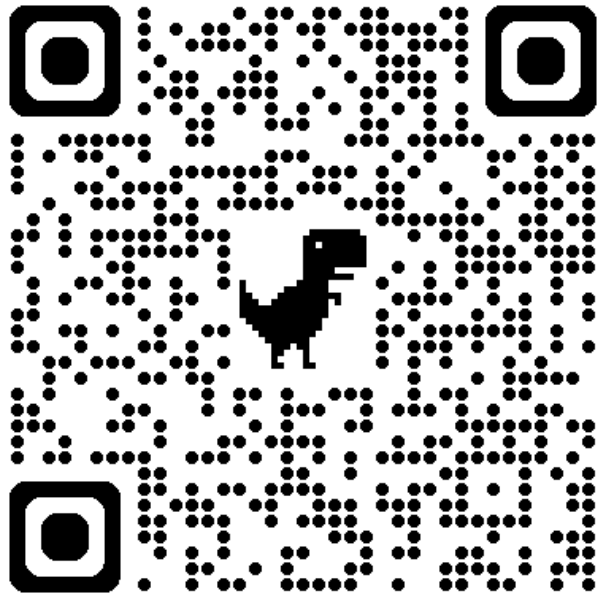

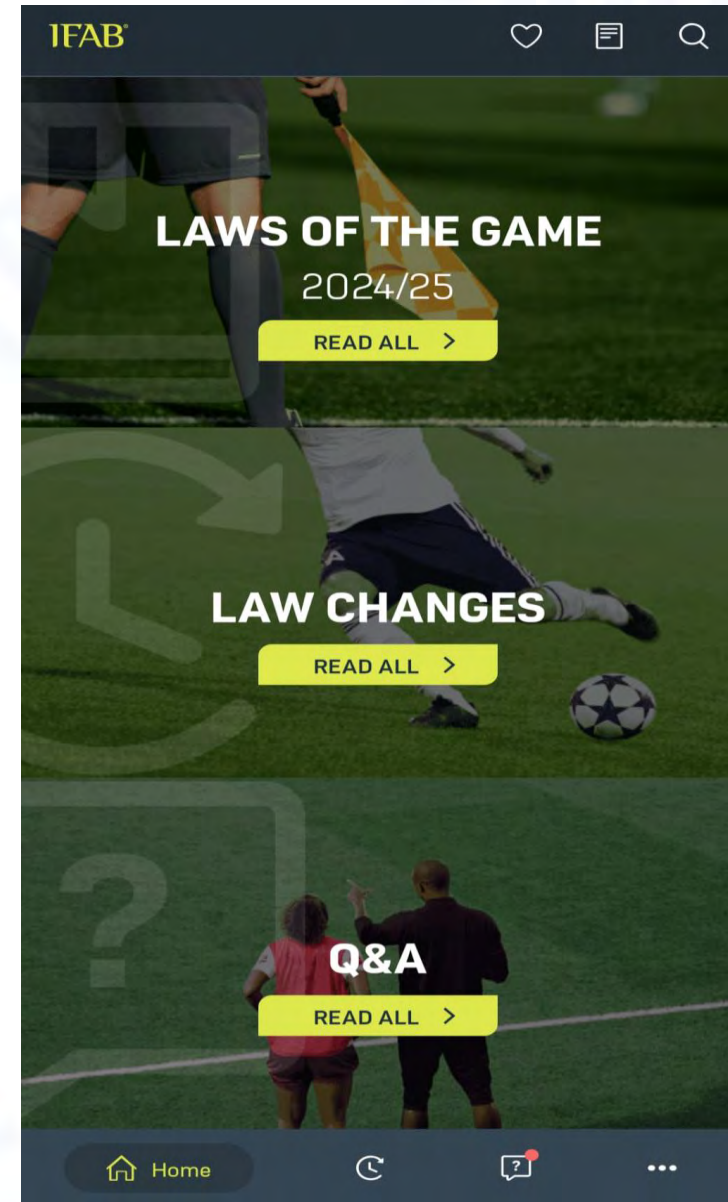

Volunteer Registration



Steps to become a Region 68 volunteer:

- 1. Register to be a head coach, assistant coach, team manager and/or referee for Fall 2023 at camarilloaysosoccer.org using the same email address & password when you registered your player(s). Must be 18 years or older**
- 2. Submit your background check through Sterling Volunteers. (adult volunteers only)**
- 3. Get fingerprinted (Live Scan – adult volunteers only)**
- 4. Have your ID checked by a CVPA-certified board member**
- 5. Take appropriate volunteer training**
- 6. Take safety courses**



Sterling Volunteers is our 3rd party background check company. Once a volunteer submits the application, an email will be sent from Sterling with a link to complete the background check within 72 hours.

There is NO COST to a Region 68 volunteer. The Region covers the \$25 fee.

Special notes:

- Background checks for current military, law enforcement and 1st responders take longer to come back. Must list their employer to get through faster
- Some mobile devices are not compatible with registration. iPad and Android devices are now compatible
- If you are using a work computer or work tablet, there may be a firewall which prevents you from accessing the volunteer verification form (Background check form) button

Due to County, State and Federal reporting, Background Check Processing can take up to 10 business days. Self disclosures can add an additional 5 business days.

Access to Training - You will access the training system from this page by clicking the "AYSO" button next to your volunteer record. You will be automatically logged in to the training system.

Safesport - to access your FREE training, that will update your AYSO status, please use this link to enroll: <https://safesporttrained.org/?KeyName=tsVWe36Xa6PS3b5NzOug>. You do not need to upload your Safesport results unless you are supplying a completed certificate from July 1, 2021 - December 31, 2021. Safesport will automatically update your profile, generally within 2 hours of completion.

Note: Youth Volunteers (anyone under the age of majority in your state) are not required to take this training.

Additional Users - If you invited an Additional or Secondary User to your account, or you are the Additional User you must accept the invitation sent via email from Sports Connect and create your own username and password. To access training, the Additional User will need to login to their own Sports Connect account and follow the steps above.

Protecting Children

- The Child Protection Acts (1993, 1997) enabled screening of volunteers who work with children and mandated reporting of suspected child abuse
- AYSO is a mandated reporter of suspected abuse in many states and asks any adult who suspects abuse to file a good faith report



Mandated reporting is generally required when a child is:

- physically injured by other than accidental means, subjected to willful cruelty or unjustifiable punishment, or sexually abused or exploited
- neglected by a parent or caregiver who fails to provide adequate food, clothing, shelter, medical care or supervision

The State of California has penalties for failing to report.

Supervision Protocols

- Coaches are responsible for all players until they are picked up or leave the area as authorized by parents
- Parents must not “drop” players off at fields without contact with coaches
- No child shall be left unsupervised after a game or practice
- The AYSO “Buddy” system must have at least 3 players



Excluded Activities

Because of known risks of injury and insurance coverage restrictions, AYSO does not allow the following activities:

- Inflatable amusement devices
- Fireworks or the sale of fireworks
- Amusement or carnival rides
- Tractor pulls or hayrides
- Rock climbing walls, bungee jumping or bungee type rides
- Trampolines, other high-risk activities
- AYSO's insurance does not cover adults, including registered volunteers, when playing in a game of soccer unless it is an authorized AYSO Adult Soccer game
- Under no circumstances should adults play in scrimmages or games against minors. Serious injuries have occurred

 - 3 – 4 games
 - Section 10 Playoffs (Bakersfield, February following Fall season)
 - 1 WEEKEND (Saturday & Sunday) for teams that win their brackets during Area 10W Playoffs



Sportsmanship



- Avoid “Running Up the Score”
 - Generally defined as a point differential of more than 5 goals
 - The responsibility is on the coach, not the referees
 - Game cards will be reviewed and a Warning may be issued for violations
 - Subsequent violations can result in a disciplinary hearing at HQ
 - Keep It Fun for BOTH Teams
 - Keep It Fun for BOTH Sidelines
 - Keep It Fun for BOTH Coaches
