Positive Coaching


AYSO requires coaches to create a positive experience for every player in AYSO. Encouraging player's effort leads to a greater environment, improved skills and stronger motivation in players.



Banner Guidelines:

- All banner must include:
 - AYSO (in ALL CAPS)
 - Region 54 & Area E
 - Team Name
 - o Division (eg., BU6, GU10, etc)
 - Coach & Assistant Coach Names
 - Team Parent Name
 - Players' FIRST NAMES ONLY
 - At least one soccer ball image



Banner Guidelines:

- NOT ALLOWED
 - Players' last names
 - Jersey numbers
 - Any personal identifiers
- This is part of our Safe Haven policy to protect palyer identity and safety.


- Coach bag & Coach Shirt

- ID Badge worn at all practices & games



PRACTICE POLICIES & FIELD USE

- Practices allowed only at permitted fields
- Respect other coaches time slots & field space
- Start and end practices on time
- All players must wear proper equipment
- NO PETS ALLOWED on any AYSO practice or game fields
- Clean up after every practice no trash left behind
- Follow all Region guidelines
- No jewelry allowed at practices or games






UNIFORM DISTRIBUTION

TEAM UNIFORMS

- Uniforms will be handed out on a first come, first serve basis.
- Only Coach or Certified Team Parent can pick up uniforms
- Uniforms will be distributed to coaches who have completed all safety requirements
- Distribute uniforms from smallest to largest player
- Jersey numbers are not chosen by players or families
- Uniforms will only be replaced if they are 2 sizes too large for a player
- EX: If player needs extra small but receives a small, we will not replace it. NO EXCEPTIONS
- Region will notify all coaches of uniform pick up date
 - ₩ Uniform colors are not guaranteed, it is on a first come, first serve basis.




DIVISION SPECIFICS

COMPETITION POINTS

- Each win counts for 7 points
- A tie is worth 3 points
- A loss is worth 0 points
- Goal Bonus: 1 point per goal, up to 3 goals (max 3 points)
- 3 point deduction for coach/spectator removal
- Blowout game point deduction 3 points will be deducted
- Competition points are awarded from the referee points the teams earn

In addition to volunteer points, teams earn Competition points based on game outcomes.











How to Earn Volunteer Points

- Refereeing games (Center referee or Assistant referee)





REGION 54 TOURNAMENTS

Region 54 tournament teams will be made up of current registered Region 54 players only. All teams must provide referee support. Tournament teams are expected to represent Region 54 with exceptional sportsmanship, effort, and class at all times.


Area Playoffs

- Area E Playoffs are the post-season tournamnet for U10, U12, & U14 core teams. Teams from Region 54 will compete against other top teams from the following neighboring regions.
 - Region 59 West Grove
 - Region 114 Long Beach
 - Region 154 Cypress
 - Region 159 Los Alamitos
 - Region 177 Long Beach/Belmont Shore
- Teams representing Region 54 will travel to the hosting regions for playoff matches.

All-Star Teams

- Each Fall season, Region 54 forms All-Star Teams in the U10, U12, & U14 divisions to represent Cerritos in the All-Star Tournament.
- One boys and one girls team per division will be selected
- Coaches may nominate players to attend All-Star tryouts
- All players must attend tryouts to be eligible
- Players will only be placed on an All-Star team in the Region has enough interest, eligible players and a certified coach.
- Coach must complete an All-Star application
- Coaches must be in good standing and all safety certifications must be complete





SUN KISSED CUP - REGION 54 TOURNAMENT

The Sun Kissed Cup is Region 54's end-of-season tournament for our U8, U10, & U12 core divisions. This tournament is designed to determine which teams will advance to the Area E playoffs.




Requirements:

- Met the minimum referee point requirements
- Followed Region 54's sportsmanship and conduct standards
- Teams in U10 & U12 will only participate in this tournament if there is enough teams in their bracket
- U8 teams do not advance to AREA Playoffs, this is a fun tournament for teams that meet the requirements to participate

Conclusion of the Sun Kissed Cup:

- 1st and 2nd place teams will receive medals
- The top two teams in each division (U10 & U12) will advance to Area E Playoffs
- A 3rd place team may be selected to advance based on availability and Area tournament structure
- Participation in this tournament is a reward for teams that performed well on the field and in fulfilling volunteer and referee commitments throughout the season.
- This is a great opportunity for U8 teams to participate in this tournament so that players can understand the concept of tournament play, especially for those that will be moving up to U10.





BLOWOUT GAME GUIDELINES

Avoiding Blowout Games



Blowout games go against multiple AYSO principles and undermine the experience for both teams. Coaches at all levels are expected to manage matches responsibly to protect the intergrity of the game. A score differential of <u>6 or more goals</u> is considered a blowout. Coaches are responsible for preventing blowout situations through in-game adjustments.



Winning Coach - What Can You Do:


- Stop attacking once your team has a 5- goal lead.
- Move stronger players to defense or goalie.
- Encourage passing only play and possession style soccer.
- Use the opportunity for player development in less experienced positions.



Losing Coach - What Can You Do:

- Emphasize effort, attitude, and learning from adversity.
- Use a water break to reset your players mentally and tactically.
- Reinforce confidence, resilience, and team spirit.
- Remain positive!





BLOWOUT GAME GUIDELINES

BLOWOUT GAME POINT DEDUCTION



Region 54 and Area E have adopted this rule in alignment with our values of sportsmanship, respect, and fair competition. This rule has now been implemented at the Section level.



If a team wins by 6 or more goals, 3 competition points will be deducted from their total:

- This rule applies regardless of intent
- There are no exceptions
- Both the head coach and assistant coach are held accountable for blowout results



This policy will be enforced at both the Region & Area level and applies to both head coach & assistant coaches:

- 1st Blowout Notification
 - Email and verbal warning from the Coach Administrator
 - RC (Regional Commissioner) is copied
 - Team competition points will be deducted
- 2nd Blowout Notification
 - o Email outlining a 1-game suspension for the head and or assistant coach
 - Sent to the Coach, RC, and Area Director
- 3rd Blowout Notification
 - Email sent to Coach, RC, and Area Director
 - May result in removal from the team
 - o If there is no qualified assistant coach to take over, the team may be disbanded for the remainder of the season

PIE = Positive, Instructional, & Encouraging





Positive: Coaches should focus on what players are doing well and offer constructive feedback rather than criticism.



Instructional: Coaches should provide clear explanations and demonstrations of skills, helping players understand how to improve.




Encouraging: Coaches should offer support and motivation, helping players build confidence and a positive attitude.



The **PIE** philosophy is a core part of AYSO's commitment to player development & good sportsmanship. It encourages coaches to be positive role models and create a positive experience for all players.













EXTRA PROGRAM





The AYSO EXTRA Program is a higher-level competitive program within AYSO designed for skilled players who are seeking a more challenging level of play while still participating in the AYSO philosophies and structure. This is **not a recreational team** - EXTRA is a **year-long commitment** for both players and families.



What is the EXTRA Program?


- EXTRA teams participate in inter-regional games against other AYSO EXTRA teams across Area E and sometimes beyond.
- The program runs for a full year, typically beginning in Fall & continuing through Spring.
- EXTRA <u>players may not participate</u> on any other AYSO team or on <u>non-AYSO teams</u> (e.g., club teams) during the year.



How to Join?

- All new players and returning players must tryout
 - o Players are required to attend at least one tryout session, but are highly encouraged to attend both.
- Tryouts are conducted by a third-party training organization to ensure unbiased evaluation.
- Team selections are made by the trainers, with final input & approval from the Regional Commissioner
- Final roster are submitted to the Area Director for approval
- Attendance at tryouts does not guarantee selection
- Tryout are held in the Spring season for the upcoming Fall season.
- Region 54 is required to host two tryout weekends for each division.





SILENT WEEKEND



Silent Weekend is one of Region 54's most meaningful and intentional events. We host two Silent Weekends each year - one during the Fall season and one during the Spring season.



The purpose of Silent weekend is to:

- Let players think, communicate, and problem-solve independently
- Help coaches and parents observe players's decision-making without interference
- Foster greater player development and sportsmanship



During Silent Weekend:

- There is no coaching, shouting, or instructing from the sidelines
- Players, coaches, parents, and spectators must remain quiet & respectful throughout the game
- Referees are instructed to enforce Silent weekend expectations
- U6 teams are exempt



What Can We Do?

- Applaud & cheer using non-verbal support (signs, thumbs up, rally towels)
- Remain calm and positive on the sidelines
- Allow players space to learn and make decisions on the field



What NOT to Do:

- No yelling player names or instructions
- No coaching from the sidelines (even "positive" or "helpful" comments)
- No reacting to referee decisions
- Per AYSO National Policy
 - Noise makers, horns, whistles, and music of any kind are strictly prohibited and not allowed at any AYSO-sanctioned event.

REFEREES: THE HEART OF THE GAME



Referees are essential volunteers in AYSO and play a crucial role in creating a safe, fair, and fun environment. Every game needs at least one certfied referee, without them, kids can't play. AYSO referees are trained and supported at the Regional, Area, and National levels, and we invite all parents, youth, and volunteers to get certified and get involved.



All referees must:

- Be registered as AYSO volunteers
- Wear the official referee uniform
- Follow pre-game duties (equipment checks, field inspections, game card collection)
- Referees are also expected to submit game reports for any serious incidents, injuries, or misconduct.
- Referees not in proper uniform or without completed safety certifications will not be permitted to officiate.



NO REFEREES = NO GAMES

• Games will be forfeited if no certified referee is present. Coaches are responsible for communicating this requirement and organizing referee coverage.


YOUTH REFEREE PROTECTION POLICY



Many of our referees are <u>youth volunteers</u> gaining experience and giving back to the game. Region 54 has a **ZERO-TOLERANCE policy** toward any negative comments or verbal abuse towards youth referees.

- Absolutely no comments, complaints, or coaching from the sidelines directed at youth referees will be tolerated.
- Board members will be present at all games where youth referees are officiating to monitor compliance.
- Violations may result in removal from the field or further disciplinary action.
- To ensure a clear working area for officials, team parents must sit on the half of the field opposite the assistant referees.









Region 54 supports and implements the U.S. Soccer Referee Abuse Prevention Policy, which protects both adult and youth referees.

Key Principles:

- Respect the Call The referee's decision is final.
- Protect our Referees Their emotional and physical safety matters.
- No Physical Contact Except for friendl post-game handshakes.

<u>Unacceptable Behavior Includes:</u>

- Level 1: Verbal taunting, sarcasm, or disrespect
- Level 2: Intimidation, retaliation, or threatening language
- Level 3: Aggression, cyberbullying, doxing
- Level 4: Discriminatory language or physical abuse

Consequences - Violations may result in disciplinary action at the Region, Area, or National level:

- Warnings or suspensions
- Removal from coaching roles
- Family bans from fields
- Permanent expulsion from AYSO
- The Referee Abuse Penalties Matrix defines further consequences for both physical & non-physical misconduct.



- Parents / Spectators / Players
- Referee protection is non-negotiable and will be strictly enforced in every division
- Respect the Call, Respect the Whistle, Respect the Game

REFEREE RESPONSIBILITIES BY DIVISION

DIVISION REQUIREMENTS

U6: The home team coach referees the game. Referee certification is not required, but U8 Official Referee Course (online) is strongly encouraged.

U8: Each team must provide a Center Referee. Minimum certification : U8 Official Referee Course (online) .

U10 & U12: Each team must provide three(3) certified referees (1 Center, 2 ARs). All must complete the Regional Referee Training (online + in person).

U14: Requires Intermediate-level Center Referee and two ARs with at least Regional Certification.

U16: Requires Advanced-level Center Referee and two ARs with Regional Certification.

U8 & Up: Must provide 3 certified referees per team for at least half the season.







REGION 54 SAFETY GUIDELINES



Safety is our #1 priority. All participants, volunteers, and families are expected to follow these safety policies at all practices and games.



NO PETS ALLOWED

- PETS ARE NOT PERMITTED on any AYSO practice or game fields!!
- This is an AYSO National Policy
- If a pet is present, Region officials will ask you to leave immediately
- Bringing pet puts us at risk of losing our field permits
- NO FIELDS = NO GAMES! Please leave your pets at home.
- NO EXCEPTIONS!

No Jewelry Allowed

- During practices or games, this includes earrings
- Players may not tape ove earrings
- If asked by referee to remove jewelry, they must comply
- This is an AYSO National Policy based on player safety

Drop-Off Policy

• It is strongly recommended that parents remain present during practices and games





REGION 54 SAFETY GUIDELINES



Safety is our #1 priority. All participants, volunteers, and families are expected to follow these safety policies at all practices and games.

Incident Reports: all incidents involving injury, violence, vandalism, or misconduct must be reported using the official AYSO Incident Report Form

- Forms can be found at ayso54.org > Forms & Docs
- Submit completed forms to the Safety Director and Regional Commissioner within 24hrs
- Reports are also required for damage to city property or any safety concern

Field Safety Rules

- All goals must be anchored before the start of any game
- Anchors are available at the Region 54 tent (first game of the day picks up, last game of the day returns)
- Players may NOT hang on goals this is a major safety violation and a leading cause of serious injury
- Do not allow children to play on, swing, or hang from goals ever!

Heading Policy

- Per AYSO National Policy
 - Headers are NOT permitted for players in U6 through U12 divisions
 - o Any intentional header in these divisions results in an indirect free kick for the opposing team.

** All safety rules are designed to protect our players. Please ensure they are followed at all times.

What is AYSO Playground?

• It is a child development program that will help develop, in collaboration with the parent, the child's fundamental motor skills using soccer as a common thread.








- Playground Sessions about an hour to an hour & half
- Practice will take place on Friday evenings, small sided game will be held after.
- There is NO competition in AYSO Playground
- Playground will help players develop fundamental motor skills
- Playground will be lead by Certified Lead Coaches with parent involvement.





Non-Competive Divisions

Co-ed U6

- 4v4 / 6 players per roster
- No score / no goalkeepers / no throw-ins / no slide tackle
- 30 minute game / 6 minute quarters / half-time 2-3 min.
- Coach is the referee

Boys & Girls U8

- 7v7 / 9 players per roster
- Score will be kept/ goalkeepers are introduced / build-out line introduced / no slide tackle / NO HEADERS / No punting
- 40 minute game/ 10 min quarters / half-time 2-3 min.
- Certified Referee Required (3) per team / team Referee points will be earned
- All players must play at least 1/2 the game

Required Equipment

- Shin guards must be worn at all practices and games No EXCEPTIONS
- Cleats preferred
- Size 3 soccer ball
- NO Jewlery (this includes practices as well) medical purposes only






BUILD OUT LINE


The purpose of the build out line is to teach players how to advance the ball out of the back by keeping the ball in possession, now becoming the attacking team. This will facilitate player development by allowing the attacking team the opportunity to receive and play the ball in a controlled method rather than the chaotic, more common method of punting the ball up the field and the ensuing scramble for possession (which is usually lost to the opposing team 80% of the time). In addition, players learn to control the ball, have less opportunity to head the ball, and reduce the dangerous play of high kicking because the ball remains on the ground.

BUILD OUT LINE & OFFSIDE

The build-out line shall be used as the line to determine offside. Players cannot be penalized for an offside offense between the halfway line and the build-out line.

- Score is kept/ goalkeepers / no slide tackle
- 50 minute game / 12 min quarters / half-time 2-3 min.
- 3 Certified Referees are required per team / team Referee points will be earned

- Build-out line is used / No punting allowed / NO HEADERS
- All- Stars & Area Playoff Tournaments

Boys & Girls U12


- 9v9 / 12 players on a roster
- Score is kept / goalkeepers / no slide tackle
- 60 minute game / 15 min quarters / half-time 2-3 min
- 3 Certified Referee are required per team / team Referee points will be earned
- All players must play at least 1/2 the game
- No build-out line / Off-side rule implemented / Punting allowed/ NO HEADERS
- All-Star & Area Playoff Tournaments

Required Equipment

- Shin guards must be worn at all practices and games NO EXCEPTIONS
- Cleats preferred
- Size 4 soccer ball
- No Jewlery (this includes practices as well) medical purposes only

- 3 Certified Referees Required for all teams


Boys & Girls U16

TEAM GAME DUTIES

FIELD SET UP

First Game of the Day - will need to set up the field which includes goals, flags & touching up the field if needed.

Last Game of the Day - will need to break down the field which includes taking down nets, setting goals to the side, putting flags away and making sure all trash is picked up.

Artesia High School: If you are scheduled to play at Artesia equipment will need to be picked up from Cab Lane by the home team (first game of the day) and home team (last game) will need to bring equipment back to Cab Lane.

Please make sure you communicate to your families that we need to follow and guidelines at all practice & game locations. Please pick up your trash and make sure we use designated areas.







DIVISION SPECIFICS

ZERO TOLERANCE

As a coach you are responsible for managing your team and parents during the game. You should make it clear to parents that they will be ejected from the field if their behavior is inappropriate.
