### Laguna calls on residents to limit water use

City officials are calling on a voluntary reduction to combat the ongoing drought conditions in the state.

### BY ANDREW TURNER

Laguna Beach city officials are asking residents and local businesses to continue to fight persistent drought conditions by reducing the amount of water they use.

The appeal to the community comes after Gov. Gavin Newsom called on Californians to voluntarily scale back their water usage by 15% to combat dry weather conditions contributing to drought throughout much of the state. "We're concerned about what another dry year will bring, and because of that, we are asking residents to do simple, common-sense things to stretch our water supplies," Laguna Beach Mayor Bob Whalen said in a prepared statement issued this week. "If we continue to get dry year after dry year, there's go in the state of the

Newsom has declared a regional drought state of emer-gency for 50 counties in the state. Southern California was not part of the area covered in that order.

Laguna Beach was named ne of five national winners in the ninth annual Wyland Na-tional Mayor's Challenge for Water Conservation last year.



### Increase seen in hospital visits due to COVID

But county health officials are not yet considering a mask mandate despite the rise in new cases

COVID hospitalizations are climbing in Orange County, but county health officials aren't sounding the alarm just yet. The Orange County

The Orange County Health Care Agency recently reported an increase in hos-pitalizations from the 126 cases reported on Tuesday to 143 cases on Wednesday. The number of intensive care unit patients fell from 59 to 35 in that same time frame.

Thursday, data showed that hospitalizations were at 149 and intensive care units cases at 39 in area hospitals.

### Costa Mesa to place tax liens on delinquent cannabis dispensaries

The City Council decided to shift some of the burden of the illegal operations to landowners, transferring long-owed city fines to the owner's property taxes. BY SARA CARDINE

After issuing code violation notices and citations to illegal annobis and citations to illegal annobis and property owners — a practice that, in recent years, has racked up \$122,475 in unpaid fines — the city of Costa Mesa is upping its nuisance abatement game. City Council members this week passed a resolution to place delinquent citations on the country's property tax roll as a lien against offending properties, meaning owners would have unpaid fines added to their property tax bills as a special assessment.

Failure to pay the tax for three consecutive years would allow the county's tax collector to sell

the delinquent property.

"We've used code enforcement, we've partnered with the

D.A. We've done as much as we D.A. We've done as much as we can that was currently on the books," Mayor Pro Tem Andrea Marr said of the move in a July 20 council meeting. "This is an attempt by staff to give us another tool in [our] toolbox."

Finance Director Carol Molina

Finance Director Carol Molina explained when businesses are identified as operating without a license or violating the city's building and municipal codes, the business owner and owner of the site are fined and given 30 days to request an administrative hearing to resolve issues. If no action occurs, the matter goes to the Finance Department, and those given citations are allowed another 30 days to correct the problem and pay fines, which may include additional delinquency fees.

A list of delinquent dispensa-ries and property owners indi-cates 58 outstanding citations on 12 properties has so far ac-crued the \$122,475 in uncol-lected fines.

"These citations are older than 60 days and have greater than \$250 fees and fines," Molina told the council. "The citees have been provided multiple opportunities to pay these fines and directly contact Fiance Department staff to handle these citations." Molina and City Atty. Kimberly Hall Barlow assured any property owner unaware an illegal dispensary is operating on
