Game Change App Usefulness

- Use it to follow games and to watch if someone on your team sets up a phone
- Scorekeeping and impact on players
 - Need 2-3 from each team
- Must track players in the field to make eligible for All-Stars

TEAM MANAGER APP

Spectators- etiquette and expectations

Spectators can only be in spectator area

Adhere to rules at each league's fields

No smoking (of any kind), drinking, profanity, or aggressive behavior

Spectators are to support and cheer, or keep quiet

Leave coaching to the coaches

Leave umpiring to the umpires

Leave playing to the players

Sit, back, relax and enjoy the game!

Expectations of play

At levels of play, every rostered player present at the start of a game must participate in each game for **a minimum of six defensive outs** and bat at least once. Six defensive outs is defined as "A player enters the field in one of the nine defensive positions when his/her team is on defense and occupies that position while six outs are made." **Bat at least one time** is defined as "A player enters the batter's box with no count and completes that time at bat by being retired, by reaching base safely and is retired by force or tag out; scores a run; or the half inning ends."

If, within a game, **a player does not meet those requirements, he/she will start the next scheduled game**, play any previous requirement not completed in the prior game, as well as the requirement for the current game before being removed. **Managers are penalized for not meeting playing time requirements.** First infraction is a warning, followed by more serious penalties if infractions continue.

There is no exception to this rule unless the game is shortened for any reason, at which time the local league may elect not to impose a penalty on the manager/coach.

Please contact a board member if your coach is not following these requirements.

LL Rules and Expectations

Little League strives to create an environment that is as safe as possible both on and off the field. Little League does not tolerate any type of abuse against a minor, including, but not limited to, sexual, physical, mental, and emotional (as well as any type of bullying, hazing, or harassment). Little League's goal is to prevent child abuse from occurring through required screenings, training and education, awareness, and mandated reporting of abuse.

Local Little League programs must establish a zero-tolerance culture that does not allow any type of activity that promotes or allows any form of misconduct or abuse (mental, physical, emotional, or sexual) between players, coaches, parents/guardians/caretakers, spectators, volunteers, and/or any other individual. League officials must remove any individual that is exhibiting any type of mental, physical, emotional, or sexual misconduct and report the individual to the authorities immediately. Local Little League programs who fail to enforce the zero-tolerance culture or fail to abide by the terms of this policy will face potential revocation or termination of their Little League charter.

LL Rules and Expectations

Little League Baseball and Softball have always strived to create a safe and healthy environment for all Little Leaguers and their families. There are certain requirements from the SafeSport Act that Little League International and all local little league programs must adhere to.

Reporting of Sexual Abuse involving a minor to the proper authorities

- All volunteers of a local league are now mandated reporters and could face criminal charges if the league chooses to ignore, or not report to the proper authorities, any witnessed act of child abuse, including sexual abuse, within 24 hours.
- Local leagues must be aware of the proper procedures to report sexual abuse in their state. Please reference LittleLeague.org/ChildAbuse
- Leagues must adopt a policy that prohibits retaliation on “good faith” reports of child abuse
- Leagues must adopt a policy that limits one-on-one contact with minors
- Leagues are highly encouraged to complete the below Abuse Awareness training provided by USA Baseball and SafeSport
