Is Attending a Prospect Camp a Good Idea? How Many Should I Attend?

One the keys to understanding the value of prospect camps is to educate yourself on why a particular program hosts a camp as well as knowing what you hope to achieve by attending one.

There are three primary reasons a college soccer program will host a "Prospect" or "ID" camp. First, the program will use an event to raise money; to supplement their team's budget, and/or to augment their coaches' salaries. When larger schools invite a hundred or more players and employ a requisite number of coaches from

other colleges to assess players- at \$150 dollars per athlete or more (see table on page 2), you can see how quickly the money multiplies. Secondly, programs use these events to invite identified recruits (although by NCAA rule these events must be "open") providing each a chance to pull the proverbial curtain back on their soccer program- to meet the team and experience life within their program. Oftentimes, those coaches have already seen you play in at least two different environments and have made an initial judgement on

your suitability to help their program. Lastly, some colleges use these event to actually identify and evaluate players for their programs. This reason is

more often tied to small college programs whose budgets don't allow them to travel to numerous recruiting events around the country. This provides those coaches and opportunity to get paid while attending an event where numerous players come to them. A win-win situation.

From the player's vantage point, attending a Prospect/ID camp can be an important task when it comes to ultimately choosing which college to attend. If you aren't careful though, attending Prospect/ID camps can quickly become expensive in terms of money and time as well as leading you astray from the ultimate goal of

finding the best fit for you. The key is to know WHY you should attend a particular Prospect/ID camp. One of the best reasons to attend a Prospect/ID camp is when you have identified a school to be among your very top choices. This will allow you to learn even more about the program and most importantly, the coaches and players associated with it. A second reason to attend a prospect camp is because you are connecting with a coach from a specific school you have interest in because of academics or location, who otherwise would not have a chance to see you play. Again, in this instance, you are making an informed decision as to which camp(s) to attend. The final reason to attend a Prospect/ID camp is to get identified and recruited by that program. The challenge in this scenario is that the players don't know each other, some if not most, will play out of position, and the quality of the competition is predictably uneven with a wide disparity among ages. Not an ideal scenario to showcase you at your best. This is not to say that this scenario should be avoided at all costs, but don't be surprised if the goal of getting recruited doesn't happen the way you had hoped. The lesson here is to be educated about your options and when in doubt, talk to ISC staff for guidance.

While video is rarely the only reason a player gets recruited, it is an excellent way for a coach to put a face to a name and to see some of what you are good at on the field.
