Lakeview Youth Association (LYA) Child Protection Program Policy

1. Purpose

a. The Lakeview Youth Association (LYA) is committed to providing a safe and positive environment for all youth participants. This Child Protection Program Policy outlines LYA's commitment to safeguarding children by implementing thorough background checks, mandatory training, reporting requirements, non-retaliation protections, and appropriate interaction guidelines.

2. Complete Background Checks

- a. LYA requires all volunteers to complete an annual background check using the Little League Volunteer application form.
- b. These checks are conducted through J.D. Palatine (JDP) and are used to screen for offenses that would disqualify an individual from participating in LYA activities.
- c. Any individual without a completed background check may not be identified as a team coach or volunteer, be on the field of play, or be present in dugouts.
- d. This standard applies to ALL Lakeview Youth Association sports.

3. Mandatory Training & Continuing Education

- a. All LYA Little League volunteers must complete the Little League Abuse Awareness Training annually.
- b. The training is provided at no cost and may be completed via an online interactive module, in-person sessions, or other delivery methods that accommodate the socioeconomic and demographic needs of the recipients.
- c. It is the responsibility of the league to ensure that all volunteers have successfully completed the training.
- d. This standard applies specifically to the Battle Creek Area Little League, operated by LYA.

4. Mandatory Reporting Requirements

- a. All LYA Board Members are required to report any known or suspected child abuse, including sexual abuse involving a minor, to the appropriate authorities within 24 hours.
- b. While coaches are encouraged to adhere to mandatory reporter requirements, their compliance may not always be verifiable due to confidentiality laws regarding Child Protective Services (CPS) reports.
- c. If a Board Member becomes aware of alleged abuse and cannot verify that a coach has reported it, the Board Member must report the abuse.
- d. If you suspect abuse or neglect, report it any time day or night online or by calling 1-855-444-3911.
- e. This standard applies to ALL Lakeview Youth Association sports.

5. Non-Retaliation for Reporting

- a. LYA strictly prohibits any form of retaliation against individuals who make a good-faith report of child abuse. This policy ensures that all volunteers and participants feel safe reporting concerns without fear of adverse consequences.
- b. This standard applies to ALL Lakeview Youth Association sports.

6. Restriction of One-On-One Interactions

- a. To ensure child safety, LYA *strongly discourages* one-on-one interactions between coaches/volunteers and minors unless they are within an observable and interruptible distance of another adult.
- b. Exceptions should be made only in cases of urgent or emergent situations where supervision by another adult is not possible.
- c. This standard applies to ALL Lakeview Youth Association sports.

7. Enforcement & Compliance

- a. LYA reserves the right to take appropriate disciplinary actions, including suspension or removal from volunteer roles, against individuals found in violation of this policy.
- b. Compliance with this Child Protection Program Policy is a condition of participation in LYA activities.
- c. Each sport's director is responsible for working with coaches to ensure that coaches are aware of and fully enforce this policy.

8. Review & Updates

- a. This policy will be reviewed annually to ensure it aligns with best practices and legal requirements.
- b. Any updates or modifications will be communicated to all volunteers and stakeholders.

9. Acknowledgment

a. All LYA volunteers must acknowledge receipt and understanding of this policy and agree to adhere to its provisions as a condition of participation in LYA programs.
