

All rules and regulations should be followed according to the 2026 Little League Baseball Rule Book (LL Rulebook). The rules below reaffirm select LL Rulebook rules and outline additional rules that the Ankeny Little League has adopted. If you have any questions about these, please contact your league administrator.

Other General Rules of Conduct:

1. **All adults and players are expected to follow the Little League Code of Conduct.** Coaches must remember they are setting an example for all players.
2. * Absolutely NO PROFANITY will be allowed by players, managers, coaches or parents. Use of profanity, confirmed by an umpire or Officer of the Day, shall result in an ejection for any player, manager, coach, or fan.
3. * No tobacco, alcohol, or vaping products are allowed at the Ankeny Little League complex.
4. Managers are responsible for their team’s behavior while they are on the playing field and dugout.
5. Each manager will control the conversation of his or her players toward the other team in a sportsmanlike manner. No derogatory chanting, etc. will be allowed. No direct gesturing (ex. clapping on the bases) intended to distract the pitcher will be tolerated.
6. The manager will always approach the umpire in a sportsmanlike manner.
7. Any umpire’s decision which involves judgment is final. No player, manager, or coach shall object to a judgment decision. The manager should bring umpiring complaints to the Officer of the Day/Umpire Coordinator AFTER the game. A complaint form must be completed.

NOTE: Any umpire may eject a player, manager, or coach in violation of these rules. Any Officer of the Day may eject a player, manager, coach, or fan in violation of these rules, potentially on recommendation from another Board member.

PENALTY FOR EJECTION: cannot be present at the game site for remainder of that game AND team's next game (including pre- & post-game). See LL Rules 4.07 and 9.01(d).

Ankeny Little League Baseball Incomplete Inning and Incomplete Game Guide

The following chart will serve as the official result when an Ankeny Little League regulation game* is called during an incomplete inning due to weather, curfew, hard stop time limit, darkness, light failure, or any other reason deemed necessary by the umpire or the Officer of the Day. To use the chart:

1. Along the left, find the team ahead (or tied) at the completion of the last **completed** inning (top and bottom).
2. Along the top, find the team ahead (or tied) at the moment the game is called (regardless of the point in the incomplete inning).
3. The intersection shows the official result of the game (along with the associated Little League Baseball 2026 Rulebook reference).

Notes:

- Pitches thrown in incomplete innings shall count toward pitch count totals for each player, regardless of whether the results of the incomplete inning are reflected in the final score.
- Deliberate attempts to delay the game to achieve a particular outcome of a called game will not be permitted, and could result in the game being awarded to the other team at the discretion of the umpire(s) and/or Officer of the Day.
- Tie games in the regular season will not be resumed. For purposes of official standings, a tie shall count as 0.5 of a win and 0.5 of a loss.

*** Regulation Game - Definition**

- A game shall be considered a regulation game by Ankeny Little League under any of these conditions:
 - 1) A minimum of 4 innings (5 innings for Intermediates and older) have been completed (or if the home team is leading immediately prior to or during the bottom half of this inning). Rule 4.10 (c) .
 - 2) The time limit of the game (according to Ankeny Little League ground rules) has been reached, regardless of the number of innings played.
 - 3) A game ends under the "mercy rule." Rule 4.10 (e).
 - 4) One team is leading by more than the Ankeny Little League single inning run limit for the given age group, either at completion of the last completed inning, or if the home team leads by more than this margin during the incompleting bottom half of the inning.
- A game started but not reaching regulation status is considered a suspended game, with no score and no win/loss result.

Resuming a Suspended Game

- Suspended games will be resumed at a later date according to the following guidelines:
 - 1) Result impacts the crowning of the regular season champion or which team(s) receive a bye in the City Tournament.
 - 2) If it is unknown whether a suspended early season game will meet criteria 1), the game may be resumed before this determination is officially known (e.g. during an early season scheduling gap). This will be at the sole discretion of the board.
 - 3) Any City Tournament game.
- Resumed games will be resumed with the same lineup, score, inning, outs, baserunners, and game time elapsed as the original game at the time it was suspended. For pitching and other player rules, see the 2026 Little League Baseball Rulebook.
- Subject to board discretion, team schedules, and field availability, resumed games may be completed under several scenarios:
 - a) Immediately before the next matchup of the two teams: play to the earliest definition of a regulation game (above).
 - b) Immediately before any other game on the same field: play to the earliest definition of a regulation game (above).
 - c) As a standalone event: play to the earlier of the time limit of the game (according to Ankeny Little League ground rules), the "mercy rule", or the full number of innings.

Note: Resumed City Tournament games will always be treated as a standalone event.
