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The Official 2019 Little League Rule Book shall prevail in all cases unless otherwise specified by District 17 Tournament Rules Handouts. (Confirm with District Tournament Director)

No Little League can function without the help of its Volunteers, Parents and Coaches. JCLL is more than just a place to play ball and have fun. It's a business for the children of yesterday, today and tomorrow. An organization's ability to learn, and translate that learning into action rapidly, is the ultimate competitive advantage. So it was about continuity and stability, In order for JCLL to achieve the greater goal of making JCLL respected and recognized, the board needs to remain intact as long as possible. For this reason President is to retain the position for a **2 year minimum term**. Termination of any board member can be perused if the member is detrimental to the league and its image. (Follow all JCLL Constitution and By-Laws when doing so)

Board of Directors

According to Little League International Rules board positions have a one-year term limit. In JCLL the fiscal (operating) year runs from June 1st through May 31st. As such, every June JCLL accepts nominations for every league approved board position. These names are presented to the board and placed on the ballot and voted on by all JCLL participants at Closing Ceremony. Incoming board members then assume their duties on August 1st. (note the current end of year is only because we do not have the non-profit status, once we have the non-profit status back. We will move our end of year to September 30, 2019)

Elected board members are expected to abide by and enforce Little League International Rules and JCLL By-Laws to ensure the betterment of the whole organization. Board members are also expected to attend monthly meetings and actively volunteer and/or solicit volunteers for critical league functions such as registration, Opening Day, End Season Finale, postseason tournament play, etc.

Note: () Indicates the board positions required by Little League. For Board of Directors objectives please reference the Jacinto City Little League JCLL Board Positions Descriptions and Responsibilities**

As such all elected nominees will then meet to assign officer and coordinator roles, starting with Secretary, following with President and the remaining positions to follow suit. Once those positions are assigned, the real work can begin. Status of the League shall always be first, following with the rules, financial reports, past year lessons learned and future goals.

it is the responsibility of the President to make sure that every officer has full understanding of their task and goals for the entire year. Members with good status and have not been removed or resigned in the past 3 years are eligible to be nominated to the board. Otherwise you will the current board's approval to be nominated and added to the voting ballot.

All Sections listed on this letter must be agreed upon before signing the letter agreement.

Bank Account Procedures

Opening a new bank account, items needed:

- Employer Identification Number (EIN)
- Articles of Organization or Certificate of Formation (Form 202) and Original Certificate of Filing or By-Laws, or any other Finance Agreement
- Letter of Permission (Bank Account Permissions) to open a new account, 2/3 to be the minimum number of members to open or close any account.
- Current Letter from IRS with Non-Profit status

Payouts

All payouts to be made from respectable payout account only.

(Example: Concession Petty Cash Bag used for quick runs, missing items, or short supply. Limit of \$50 cash...)

Umpires, to be paid from separate Umpire Cash Bag. Player Agent to notify Treasure/Umpire-in-Chief how many games and how many umpires, what divisions and pay rates. All Umpire Manager Fees or Dues to be paid by check, No Exceptions. Umpire Log must match the Umpire Bag Account Log. Log will be reviewed weekly, or after closing on game night.

Monthly Statements

A monthly statement will be posted to the jcllbaseball.com and copy given to Ivan Rojas at the end of each month during little league season.

Age Eligibility

Ages will be determined from latest issued Little League Rule Book Age Chart. For Softball age determination date is December 31, **for baseball the age determination date is August 31.**

Players who are **league age 4-6** are eligible to be selected to a Tee Ball team for the regular season. (Age 7 is allowed if first year, but will not be All Star eligible)

Players who are **league age 7-8** are eligible to be selected to a Pitch Machine (Coach Pitch) League Division team for the regular season. The local league board of directors may restrict this division to players who are league age 6, 7 and 8. (6yr old will not be All Star eligible)

Players who are **league age 9-10** are eligible to be selected to a Minor League Division team for the regular season. The local league board of directors may restrict this division to players who are league age 8, 9 and 10. All-star age eligibility will be based on District 17 rules.

Players who are **league age 11-12** are eligible to be selected to a Little League Major Division team for the regular season. The local league board of directors may restrict this division to players who are league age 10, 11 and 12.

Players who are **league age 13-16** are eligible to be selected to a Junior/Senior League Division team for the regular season.

Those who are not included among the league ages listed above are not eligible for any baseball division in Little League for the current season.

All players who **do not** live in the JCLL boundaries, but attend school within the boundaries are required to submit proof of school attendance. School attendance shall be established and supported by a document indicating enrollment for the current academic year, dated prior to February 1st of current year, and with the physical location of the school, from ONE of the following categories to determine school attendance by such player.

- Official/Certified School enrollment record.
- School issued report card or performance record.
- A Little League issued school form completed by the principal, assistant principal or administrator.

Registration

Registration is the responsibility of Player Agent / Registration Coordinator and President.

Registration is accomplished online via a web link from:

Online Registration for multiple players in single family or In-Person by appointment only. Please contact through email or facebook @ jclittleleague.baseball@gmail.com or [facebook.com/jcllbaseball/](https://www.facebook.com/jcllbaseball/)

New players must provide a birth certificate and Proof of Residency documents (any one item for each of the three groups). Documents need to be dated in force between February 1, 2019 and February 1, 2020. Any player that moves away from JCLL Boundaries must fill out a Little League regulations forms 11 (d) and IV (h). Once President has all submitted documents, we'll then request a waiver from Little League District 17. These documents are to be collected at the beginning of every season for each and every player, regardless if online registration has been complete already. Prior to being allowed to complete registration, **every JCLL player's parent or guardian must have read, initialed and accepted the terms of JCLL's Parents Code of Conduct**

Registration Fee

Every Year the board will gather and agree on a reasonable fee for the upcoming season. The board will keep in mind that some families need to keep the cost down for various reasons. Keeping those families in mind, there will be discounts for families' signing up more than one child. As of 7/1/2019 price will be set as **\$130.00 per child (\$100 for tee-ball) – regular season / \$65 per child – fall season.**

Early Registration ends: December 31, 2019 (\$10 off)

Regular Registration ends: January 31, 2020

Late Registration Starts: February 1, 2020 (\$10 late fee per child)

Available Discounts

2nd player - \$20 each player

3rd player - \$30 each player

4th player - \$40 each player

5th player - \$50 each player

(Incentives to be discussed annually at first board meeting of August)

Guardian Volunteer Work Program

Parents willing to volunteer work and are not eligible for Player Sponsorship. Selling fundraiser chocolates or working Concession stand are the best ways to reduce registration cost. A Maximum amount of 50% registration fee debt can be worked off. Board Members with children playing for the league, only registration fee will be waived; Funds meant for fundraising will need to be paid.

Player Sponsorship

Board of Directors will select a few (max of 10 players or one player per team) individuals each season to waive registration fees for the year. If the individual selected has siblings, they too will be considered for sponsorship. An agreement with parent/guardian has to be signed if this option is selected, with an agreement to work concession stand for the season. A work schedule will be created by the concession manager and the parent/guardian.

(Do Not approve if parent/guardian can't work concession stand)

Player Fundraiser/Sponsorship

Every new season a fundraiser/Sponsorship goal will be set to match or exceed the previous year.

Fundraiser/sponsorship manager will be responsible for establishing an execution plan. A Call list of Potential sponsors will be review annual and revised. A donation letter to be review and revised annually or as needed.

Every player will be given goods to sale and collect fundraiser money for the league. This is a great way for players and parents to get involved and help raise money for the league. Money collected goes towards end of year party and to help support the league. All League money is to be turned into the President, Treasurer or Fundraiser/Sponsorship Manager.

Concession Stand Buyout

The league wants to encourage all regular volunteers to help around the concessions stands when their children are not playing. Concession buyout money is collected to help offset the cost of having other work the concession stands.

This fee will not be included with Registration fee. For those who have not paid the concession stand buyout money portion will be asked to work concession stand during the All-stars season if your child is selected to play for the JCLL All-stars.

Concession Stand buyout cost: \$15 per player, no exceptions

Reminder this money is to pay concession workers, so that every parent can enjoy game day.

Event Day Vendor Sales

JCLL wants to encourage all local vendors to come support the league by setting up booths for main event days such as Opening Day, Super Saturdays or Closing Ceremony. Please review Jacinto City Local laws about restriction to certain sales.

Vendor Booth cost: \$25 per booth, no exceptions

*****All League money is to be turned into the President, Vice-President, Treasurer or Fundraiser/Sponsorship Manager*****

Skills Assessment

Skills evaluations are typically held for JCLL on the January 27th thru 31st for T-Ball, Pitch Machine and Minors @ 7:00 pm. February 3rd thru 7th for Majors, Juniors and Seniors @ 7:00 pm. Assessment to be held on Leo Foster Field for all players in all divisions. Skills evaluation typically includes batting, times running, fielding grounds balls and fly balls, receiving throws, and in Minors, Majors, Junior and Senior, Pitching. Players should arrive at the designated time, warmed up, in baseball clothing and with baseball equipment (cleats, leather glove, hat, bat, etc.).

Draft Days

Player Agent to direct tryout and draft with the help of Registration Officer.

Draft to be scheduled for:

February 1, 2020

T-Ball at 10:00 a.m., Pitch Machine @ 12:00 pm., Minors @ 2:00 pm on Leo Foster field.

February 8, 2020

Majors @ 10:00 a.m., Juniors / Seniors @ 1:00 pm on Harmond Field.

Provide a Walk-Up, On-Site Registration. A draft option must be agreed before draft between a manager and the Player Agent covering a special condition. There are four options available through the approved Little League draft process.

Draft Orders

- T-Ball, Pitch Machine and Minors coaches will draw for snake draft orders.
- Majors and up will draft in the reverse from the end playoff standings.
 - (Number one team will pick last and last team will have first draft choice)
 - (Coaches draw number for first pick)

For all divisions the order of draft will be a snake draft. Players who did not attend tryouts will be selected per blind draft plan C as stated in little league green book.

Team Keeping

Returning team managers before every season will have the option to keep their team as is and only draft for new players to replace players who have aged out of division.

Only first time team managers taking over a preexisting roster will have the option to trade for a maximum of 2 players no more than 1 player from a single team. They will also have the number 1 draft pick that season only. If more than one new manager they will all draft as stated above.

Brother/Sister Option

The "Brother/Sister Option" is available when there are two or more siblings eligible to be drafted. After the first sibling is drafted, the manager of that team automatically has the option to draft the brother or sister of that player on the team's next turn in the draft. If the manager does not exercise the Brother/Sister Option on the next turn, the sibling becomes available to be drafted by any other team.

Brother/Sister Option of a Player Currently on a Team

If a league is utilizing Draft Method 'A' as outlined in the 2016 Little League rulebook, players from the previous season remain on their previous season's team. This may create a situation where a player currently on a team has a brother or sister in the draft. When this happens, the "Brother/Sister Option of a Player Currently on a Team" option comes into play, and a manager may submit an option on the brother or sister of the player that is currently on his/her team. If a manager is interested in exercising this option, it must be submitted in writing to the Player Agent at least 48 hours before the draft begins. Once the draft begins, the manager must exercise this option within the first three draft rounds. If the manager does not draft the sibling within the first three rounds, the sibling becomes available to be drafted by any other team.

Sons/Daughters of Managers

When the manager of the team has a son or daughter eligible to be drafted, he/she may use the "Sons/Daughters of Managers" option to draft his/her child to the team. This option must be submitted to the Player Agent at least 48 hours before the draft begins. This option always takes priority over the other 3 options. The manager must exercise this option before a specified round, which depends on the division and league age of the player. Failure to exercise the option on or before the specified round results in the son/daughter becoming eligible to be drafted by any other team.

Sons/Daughters of Returning Coaches

If a league is using Draft Method 'A', it may be possible for a returning coach to exercise an option through the team's manager. Since new coaches to the team cannot be appointed nor approved until after the draft, the option is only available to coaches returning to the team, provided the following two criteria are met by the returning coach:

The coach has served as a coach or manager at any level for the past TWO years, AND The coach is returning to the same major league team as last year.

If BOTH of the conditions listed above apply, the manager must submit this option to the Player Agent at least 48 hours before the draft begins. Just like the Sons/Daughters of Managers Option, the Sons/Daughters of Returning Coaches Option must be exercised before a specified round, which depends on the division and league age of the player. Failure to exercise the option on or before the specified round results in the son/daughter becoming eligible to be drafted by any other team.

A player may be picked up during the season with a valid reason (illness, school, religious or vacation). See rules 4.16 and 4.17 in the little league rule book.

Ground Rules

Regular Season (10 game minimum for a full season)

- Regular season can begin after Spring Break and Playoffs should end 2 weeks before the beginning of each division first district tournament game.
- Violation of the minimum play rule shall subject the offending manager to disciplinary action per the JCLL Manual Sanctions.
- Personnel inside dugouts shall be limited to uniformed players, Manager and coaches (3).
- Managers and coaches must remain in the dugout or within the marked areas.
- There will be a five run rule limit per inning during regular season for all levels. During Playoffs District tournament run rules will apply.
- **No coach can warm up pitchers anywhere on JCLL Grounds. Only players can catch for other players.**
- All offense players must wear batting helmets when batting and or running bases.
- All catchers must wear proper gear (cup "if male", mask, throat guard) at all times.
- Umpire-in-chief will determine correct game start time, or hold delay the start of a game.
- Rainouts or rescheduled games will be played on Saturdays.
- Little League Rules shall prevail and rules not listed in this document or District Rules.
- Both teams are responsible for field preparation unless there is a team visiting from another league, in which case the home team will prepare the field (watering, bases, foul lines)
- **Home Team is responsible for scorebook keeping, the Visiting team is responsible for pitch count sheets and score board. (\$20 must be given to concession stand if no one is available to keep scorebook, failure to provide a scorekeeper or \$20 home team will forfeit the game).**
- 2 games per week for T-ball, Pitch Machine and Minors. No limit for Majors, Juniors and Seniors.
- T-Ball, Pitch Machine and Minors will be scheduled 12 games for a full season
- Majors, Juniors and Seniors will be scheduled 14 games for a full season
- Game Times will be as follows: (all games will finish the inning)
 - Tee-Ball = 1hr, 6 innings (whichever comes first)
 - Pitch Machine / Minors = 1hr 30min, 6 innings (whichever comes first)
 - Majors / Juniors/Seniors = 1hr 45min, 6 innings (whichever comes first)

Championship Playoffs

(JCLL Spring Season Championship Playoffs must finish before District 17 Tournament Games)

- Game Rules will be per District Tournament Rules.
- Being later in the Season (daylight savings) Early Game (first game) to start @ 6:30
- Game Times will be as follows: (all games will finish the inning)
 - Tee-Ball = 1hr, 6 innings (whichever comes first)
 - Pitch Machine / Minors = 1hr 30min, 6 innings (whichever comes first)
 - Majors / Juniors/Seniors = 1hr 45min, 6 innings (whichever comes first)
- Seeding will be the team with the most wins, tie breaker will be the team with the most home wins, if still a tie, the team with the most points scored will be first seed.
- 2 games per week for T-ball, Pitch Machine and Minors. No limit for Majors, Junior/Senior. All brackets will be double elimination.

All-Stars (District and International Tournaments)

****Participation on an All-Star team is a privilege and not a right for Managers, Coaches or Players.**

- District Tournaments typically begins around June 1st, Playoffs should end 2 weeks before the beginning of each division first district tournament game.
- District Tournament play in Pools and or Brackets Managers will be the First place team Manager from playoffs, unless specified by the board of directors.
- All players nominated to all-stars will have tryouts. (5-6 player nominees allowed per team unless specified by player agent).
- Nominee's selection will be by the Manager of each team, and submitted to player agent on the last game of playoffs.
- Levels of play for teams to be submitted to:

District Pool:

- TeeBall (5-6 yr olds)
- Pitch Machine 7 & 8 yr old teams
- Minors Live arm 9 yr old (8 yr may be eligible)

International tournament:

- 8, 9, 10 yr old
- 9, 10, 11 yr old
- 10, 11, 12 yr old (Majors)
- 12,13,14 yr old (Juniors)
- 14,15, 16 yr old (Seniors)
- **Team sizes** will range from **12-14 players**, the **final roster** size is made **by the team manager**.
- Player notification of making the all-star final roster will be on last game of Championship Playoffs for Teeball, Pitch Machine and Minors. **Majors, Juniors/Seniors players will not be notified till June 1st date per Little League and District Rules.**
- **Player Agent and Registration Officer are to work together and garner all the Paper work for each team with tournaments verification forms that were signed at the beginning of the season.**
- **Managers may choose 2 assistant coaches from any all-star team**, JCLL suggest that the manager from each team be asked to assist first. Make sure who will be an assistant has been background checked.
- All-Star baseball hats are to be issued for all All-Star nominees when their nominations are announced.
- New jersey's are to be issued for the International Teams only, Majors, Juniors and Seniors division. (Players will be able to choose their own jersey number, price per jersey to be determined by Uniform Coordinator). **Each player will pay for their own jersey.**
- All players must live in league boundary to be nominated for all stars. No exceptions
- **No player can be held from all-stars for any reason other than proof of residency failure.**

Field Maintenance

- During 1st coaches meeting, all managers must be present to learn the proper procedure to setting up the fields.
- Keys or lock combinations for lights, equipment shed, field essentials shed will be distributed to all managers during the first coaches meeting.
- Field maintenance includes areas outside the field, Doug outs, bleachers, warm up areas and parking lots should be cleaned up after every practice and or game regardless if you are in JCLL or visiting another league.
- Field and ground annual survey to be completed by League President/ Safety Officer / Park and Recreation Officer for ASAP Program.
- Field Maintenance Manager is responsible for keeping a record of all field equipment (tarps, racks, base anchor dig tool, bases, L-screens, Lights, Water hose / Spray Nozzle / Sprinkler system), talk for foul lines (foul line marker) and or buildings (loose doors, broken windows, Trip hazards, bleachers, dugouts and or Score box shelters).
- Field maintenance manager is responsible to schedule grass cut with Jacinto City Parks and Recreation director.
 - Recommended grass height to be kept around 3/4 inch to 1-1/4 inch.
 - Skinned areas to be dragged minimum once a week or as needed.
 - Grass edged to be trimmed and leveled once a week or as needed.
 - Fix Mounds as necessary

Pre-Season Check List

- Mow and trim the grass areas schedule.
- Check all fences for safety hazards and fix any issues or potential issues with the fence.
- Treat any mounds or other bugs that may be around.
- Work on pitcher's mounds and batter's box areas. (underlay with clay blocks).
- Work on dirt skinned areas.
- Create a fertilizer and water schedule for the season.
- Create a maintenance schedule for the season, and off season.

Covid19 Refund Policy

We want everyone one to know that Jacinto City Little League Baseball is a nonprofit league and all monies collected are used for the registration, insurance, charter, and uniform fees. With the same money collected the league purchases a variety of items need to begin any season such as but not limited to baseball, bats, gloves, catcher's equipment, field equipment and practice/training tools.

Jacinto City Little league also prides itself in giving every child the opportunity to play in our league regardless of their financial burden and is for that reason that we pay average for 30% of player fees. With the help of grants, sponsorships, and other grants we can make this possible.

Our 2020 season was placed on hold by Jacinto City and fields were locked down per the recommendations of the parks and recreation manager. We always try our best and follow all the rules and guidelines placed by our city officials. As a result, the season was wiped out and we could not open for a normal season.

Our concession sales make a huge difference on how much money we make on a year and with no sales our accounts were nearly drained with the original cost already paid to Little League and City before we were shutdown. Unfortunately, we did not receive any refunds from Little league charter and insurances paid for 2020 season.

We intended to gain some of the money through the sales of world finest chocolates, which we also a failure. With the season postponed and no parents or league activity. The money for the chocolates sales was never completed. Over 50% of parents who collected chocolates to sale have not turned in money.

Our intention will always be to give credit to those players who did not received a refund for the following year till the credit is used. As for automatic refunds, those will not be possible as uniforms and hats allowing with any other fees for the 2020 season have already been paid and used.

No refunds will be issued without a written request with Jacinto City little League Treasurer approval.
