

MINOR B DIVISION LOCAL RULES 2024

Below are the local rules for the 2023 season that will apply to the Poway National Little League Minor B Division. Selected standard Little League rules are included for emphasis and importance. It is the responsibility of each manager to comply with the Official Playing Rules of Little League Baseball and Poway National Little League.

1. Recommended Age: The recommended age for the Minor B Division is league age 7 – 10.
2. Preseason: The first half of the season will be considered preseason and will not count toward tournament standings. During the first half of the season will be coach pitch. There is no stealing during coach pitch. Players will get 3 soft toss pitches from their coach. If they do not hit, they are out. There are no walks. Pitching rules (rule 8) will be standard for the second half of the season.
3. Post Season: The season will end with a tournament. Seeding will be based on the standings from the second half of the season. The number of teams in the division will determine whether the tournament is single or double elimination.

The winner of the tournament will be crowned the PNLL Minor B League Champion. The PNLL Minor B League Champion will represent PNLL in the City Championship against Poway American Little League on a date yet to be determined.

4. Playing Time:

- a) Everyone who is present for the game will be in the batting order for that game. If a player arrives late to a game, that player will be inserted into the lineup at the Manager's discretion and held to the minimum play rule stated in rule 3c and 3d.
- b) On defense, there will be free substitutions. On offense, a continuous batting order will be used. As a result of using a continuous batting order pinch running is not allowed. In case of an injury the last out will be used as the pinch runner.
- c) In any regulation game, a player must play a minimum of 6 defensive outs and bat at least once.
- d) In addition, every player who is present and on the team roster shall participate in each game during regulation for a minimum amount based on the number of defensive innings played as outlined below.
 - 6 innings - each player must play at least 12 defensive outs
 - 5 innings - each player must play at least 9 defensive outs
- e) Each player must play at least 1 complete infield inning constituting all outs in that inning.
- f) If a team plays 3 defensive innings in a game, BUT THE GAME FAILS TO REACH Regulation per 4.10(c), each player must play at least 3 defensive outs and bat at least once.

- g) Any player who did not play the required number of outs in a game shall play in the entire next scheduled game. The manager may be suspended for at least one game at the discretion of the PNLL Board.
- h) A player must start and complete the inning in order for that inning to count towards the minimum play rule and toward the infield inning requirement.
- i) If a half-inning ends because of the imposition of the five-run limit (see below in Rule 7. Run Rule) in “Rule 2.00 – Inning,” or because batters can not bat more than once in an inning and a player on the defense has played for the entire half-inning, that player will be considered to have participated for three consecutive defensive outs for the purposes of this rule. However, if the player has not played on defense for the entire half-inning, that player will be credited only as having played for the number of outs that occurred while the player was used defensively.

4. Behavior:

The actions of players, managers, coaches, umpires and league officials must be above reproach. Any player, parent, spectator, manager, coach, umpire or league representative who is involved in a verbal or physical altercation, an incident of unsportsmanlike conduct, or commits any violation of Little League/Poway National Little League Rules at the game site or any other Little League activity, is subject to disciplinary action by the Local League Board of Directors Grievance Committee.

5. Time limits:

- a) Infield practice will be limited to 10 minutes per team only if time permits.
- b) All games must start and end on time.
- c) Each game shall have no new inning start after 1:45, which is counted from the start time not to exceed 15 minutes from the scheduled start time. The umpire or adult game coordinator may call final inning prior to the 1:45 mark. The game shall be called regardless of number of innings played.

6. Minimum Players to Start:

- a) A game may not be started with less than nine (9) players on each team. If a game cannot be started due to the inability of either team to field nine players, this shall not be grounds for automatic forfeiture, but shall be referred to the Board for a decision.
- b) If a team cannot field nine (9) players for a game due to a school-related or religious function, the manager, in good faith, must notify the President and/ or Majors Division Director with 48 hours notice. The decision to reschedule the game shall be considered and rendered by the Board.
- c) If, after a game begins, either team is unable to field at least nine (9) players according to rule 4.17 in the Little League rule book, this shall not be grounds for automatic forfeiture. The game shall be suspended and referred to the Board for a decision.

7. Run Rule:

- a) PNLL has elected not to use the Little League Baseball ten (10) run mercy rule for Minor B games. LLB

- b) (Little League Rule Book rule 5.07) Minor League Only – A five-run limit per inning is to be imposed for all innings. Once the batting team scores 5 runs this would complete the half inning.
- c) An addition to Regulation IV (i) Note 3 with regard to Minor League Baseball and Minor League Softball will permit a defensive player who has played defensively since the start of a half-inning to be credited with having played for three defensive outs when that half-inning is shortened by the five-run limit. Note: If a half-inning ends because of the imposition of the five-run limit in “Rule 2.00 – Inning,” and a player on the defense has played for the entire half-inning, that player will be considered to have participated for three consecutive defensive outs for the purposes of this rule.
- d) Exception 1 to the 5-run rule: Should a team have less than three outs and a player hits a homerun over the fence, all the runs shall score. Once the homerun hitter reaches home plate the inning is over. If a batter hits a ground rule double, the runner will advance their two allotted bases and all applicable runs will score. The inning will be over once the last applicable runner touches home plate.

8. Pitching Rules:

- a) All the pitching rules can be found in the Little League Rule Book (VI – Pitchers).
- b) In Minor B, a pitcher is limited to 2 complete innings or 50 pitches whichever occurs first.
- c) The days rest for all players age 12 and under are as follows: 1 - 20 pitches = No days rest
21 - 35 pitches = 1 calendar day rest
36 - 50 pitches = 2 calendar days rest
51 - 65 pitches = 3 calendar days rest
66+ pitches = 4 calendar days rest
- d) If the pitcher reaches their limit while facing the batter they may finish pitching to that batter until the batter reach base or is put out.
- e) Once a pitcher throws 41 or more pitches they may not play catcher during the same day.
- f) Any player, who has played the position of catcher in four (4) or more innings in a game, is not eligible to pitch on the same day.
- g) Walks are eliminated in Minor B. When the count reaches 4 balls, it will turn to 3 soft tosses from the coach. If the batter fails to put the ball in play, the batter is out.
- h) The Official Scorekeeper will be responsible for keeping count of a player’s pitches, and notify the team manager when a player is within 10 pitches of his/her limit, should the official scorekeeper forget to do this, this does not absolve the manager of the responsibility of knowing his pitch counts. The manager is ultimately responsible. The Official Scorekeeper will also notify the manager when a player has reached his pitch count. It is also highly recommended that a coach or parent keeps count of a player’s pitches as well. It is required that each manager after the game verify, by initialing the official score book that they have the same pitch counts that the Official Scorekeeper has. If there is a conflict you can discuss it with the Official Scorekeeper and if he/she agrees then the pitch counts can be adjusted accordingly, however, the Official Scorekeeper has the ultimate decision. Once the

official score keeper has signed off the book, records become official and mandatory rest periods will be observed for the pitchers based on the official score keeper's records.

- i) All these rules pertain even if a make up or tournament game causes a team to play more games in one calendar week.
- j) If a pitcher is discovered to have violated the days rest in an outing, the manager will be reprimanded at the discretion of the Board.
- k) It is the responsibility of each manager to ensure the pitching rules are followed. We want to ensure the pitcher's health is not at risk. The Vice President is also responsible to ensure compliance.
- l) During a pitching change (middle of the inning) there will be no balls thrown around the infield. m) If a pitcher is pitching and hits three (3) batters, the manager will pull the pitcher from the pitching position.

9. Catching Rules:

The catcher must wear a catcher's mitt (not a first baseman's mitt or fielder's mitt). Catchers must wear the metal, fiber or plastic type cup, a chest protector with pelvic guard and neck collar, shin guards, and a catcher's helmet and mask with a "dangling" type throat guard. The catcher's helmet must bear the NOCSAE stamp.

10. Adults in the Dugout:

One manager and no more than two (2) rostered coaches shall be allowed in the dugout at any time. Two adult coaches are authorized to base coach as long as there is a rostered adult coach in the dugout.

11. Field Preparation:

The home team shall prepare the field for play. The visiting team shall retire the field. Each team is responsible to ensure their dugout and surrounding area is clean before they leave the field. The visiting team of the last game of the day shall be responsible for pulling the trash bags and tying the top and leaving it by the trash can and putting in the new trash bag left on the handle. This is to help expedite the closing process for the board member in charge that night. The home team of the first game shall set out the cones in the outfield.

12. Batting Team:

THERE IS NO 'ON-DECK' POSITION. No player in the dugout may have a bat in hand. The batter is the only person that should have a bat in hand. Only the batter, base runners and base coaches from the batting team are allowed on the field during play. On-deck batters shall not be allowed on the field. All other players must remain in the dugout during play.

13. Bunts:

Bunting is not allowed.

14. Base Stealing:

Base stealing is allowed, however, stealing of home base is not allowed at any time, including on passed balls, wild pitches, or overthrows. A runner is free to attempt to advance to home on a batted ball in play. A runner will also advance to home when forced, for example, on a bases loaded walk. Batters are limited to 1 stolen base per batter. There is no stealing during coach pitch / coach soft toss.

15. Fielding Team:

All players not fielding a position must remain in the dugout during play.

16. Food in the Dugout:

No Food is allowed in the dugout.

17. Uniform:

Uniform consists of shirt, hat and long pants. No shorts are allowed. Number 11 and 42 are retired numbers and may not be used by any PNLL player.
