Avon Junior Athletic Association (AJAA) has been providing youth sports programs to the community since 1963. Each year, AJAA provides recreational youth programs to over 3,500 athletes making us the largest sports program in Hendricks County. At AJAA, we are proud to offer sports such as baseball, softball, football, basketball, running, volleyball, cheerleading, and hope to continue to expand the horizons in youth sports activities. Youth sports are a great way to benefit our youth by aiding in their physical health, mental wellness, and overall cognitive development. By providing the opportunity for our youth to be physically active, we reduce the risk of many health concerns such as cancer, obesity, diabetes, depression, anxiety, etc.

Mission Statement:

The purpose of the AJAA recreational cheer program is to develop and teach fundamentals of cheerleading to our athletes. As part of AJAA's community focus, each program is developed to prepare our youth athletes for continuing their development through the middle school and high school aged programs.

Our goal is that every athlete will have a positive experience, build confidence, place an emphasis on effort, and practice good sportsmanship. We strive to create a program that focuses on athletic development and teaches future cheerleaders of Avon the fundamentals of the sport.

Please Note:

 MAJORS CHEERLEADERS will take turns cheering on the Junior Orioles Football Home Games. This may mean a cheerleader will have two games in one day. This game is also MANDATORY. Please plan accordingly.

Divisions:

Cheerleaders are assigned teams based on their grade level. Every effort will be made to accommodate special requests such as siblings on a team, cheering for a certain football team, etc.

- Kindergarten- 2nd Grade
- 3rd Grade 4th Grade
- 5th Grade 6th Grade

Rules:

- No jewelry should be worn during practice or on game days. Small stud earring are permitted, but not during stunting.
- Nails must be cut short if stunting (No Fake Nails)
- Attendance: Any cheerleader that will be absent from a game or practice MUST notify the coach via email/phone/GameChanger app.
 - Please make every effort for your cheerleader to be present, as it's very important for the entire squad.
- Hair must be out of the face for safety.
- Cheerleaders should arrive to practice dressed properly in athletic shorts (no jean or khaki shorts), tanks/shirts, and tennis shoes. They should also bring a water bottle.
- Cheerleaders should arrive to games in full uniform (uniform, white shoes, and poms).
- Cheerleaders should arrive to games 15 mins. in advance for proper warm-up.
- Cheerleaders must arrive to all events with great sportsmanship and attitude, ready to work/perform.
- All stunting must comply with USA Cheer guidelines. It is important that all cheerleaders attend stunt clinics to build proper strength for safe stunting.
 - Grades KG-2nd are not permitted to stunt.
 - Grades 3rd-4th are not able to stunt above thigh level.
 - o Grades 5th-6th are not able to stunt above shoulder level.
- Cheerleaders must cheer in designated boxes painted on the sidelines of the grass field on game days.
- All cheerleaders should pay attention to the coach when facing the fans, and if facing the field, should pay attention to game play to learn game cheering.
- All cheerleaders, along with their parents/guardians should abide by the Chain of Communication in place at all times. All communication should go through your cheerleader's coach. The next chain is the League Coordinator, with the Commissioner being the next. This includes any complaints, issues, questions, etc.

Equipment Needed:

AJAA will provide players with uniforms, bows, and poms, as ordered. Cheerleaders are required to purchase white tennis shoes, plain white socks, black briefs, and an optional long sleeve black shirt.

Practice/Game Overview:

Practices will begin July 10, 2023, pending enough coach volunteers. Practices will generally be held once per week. Times are at the commissioner/coaches discretion.

All practices will be held at Cedar Elementary; unless otherwise specified.

MAJORS CHEERLEADING: Squads will rotate turns and cheer for the Jr Orioles home football games. This may result in two games in one Saturday. Please plan your schedule accordingly.

All coaches, including assistant coaches, must pass a background check to be cleared by AJAA to volunteer. You must register yourself in the software as a volunteer to be eligible as an assistant or head coach. This is also how credits are awarded, so it is important to register and roster accordingly.

Program Fees:

This expense, built into the registration fee, include, but not limited to: general expenses such as grounds materials, repairs on equipment or fields, AED rental expenses, rental space from Avon Community School Facilities, liability insurance for each player and facility, depreciation of equipment purchases, etc. Many fees go into keeping our youth players healthy and safe. Some examples that may help explain the program fees are listed below:
