

LE LEAGUE Player Residency Documentation Requirements

Per Little League Rules, to participate in Orangecrest Little League ("OCLL"), a player must be documented to live or attend school within the geographic boundaries of the league in accordance with the requirements as detailed below.

OCLL requires that player documentation be verified by a league official PRIOR to participating in tryouts or being placed on a team. Parents are highly recommended to keep their verification documentation handy throughout the season as there could be requirements to re-verify documentation at any time by a league or Little League official. Documentation must be re-verified BEFORE a player can participate in ANY post season or All Star Tournament.

A PLAYER WILL BE DEEMED TO RESIDE WITHIN THE LEAGUE BOUNDARIES IF: I.

- A. His/her parents are living together and are residing within such league boundaries, OR;
- B. Either of the player's parents (court-appointed legal guardian) reside within such boundaries. Supporting documentation MUST be dated February 1, 2016 (previous year) and February 1, 2017 (current year).

The supporting residency documentation from the above referenced dates MUST come from THREE (3) of the following categories:

- 1. Driver's License
- 2. Voter's Registration
- 3. School records
- 4. Welfare/child care records
- 5. Federal records
- 6. State records
- 7. Local (municipal) records
- 8. Support payment records
- 9. Homeowner or tenant records
- 10. Utility bills (i.e., gas, electric, water/sewer, phone, mobile phone, 15. Internet, cable or satellite records heating, waste disposal)
- 11. Financial (loan, credit. investments, etc.)
- 12. Insurance documents
- 13. Medical records
- 14. Military records
- 16. Vehicle records
- 17. Employment records

NOTE: Multiple documents from the same category ONLY satisfy one of the three requirements. Documents MUST come from THREE DIFFERENT categories.

A PLAYER WILL BE DEEMED TO ATTEND SCHOOL IN THE BOUNDARIES IF: II.

- A. The physical location of the school where they attend classes is within the boundaries of the local league. NOTE: This excludes home schools, cyber schools, sports-related schools, sports academies, or preschool or after school where a student participates outside of the primary school the player is enrolled. "School attendance" refers to the (place) physical location the player in question attends school during the traditional academic year. Once established, a location of school attendance shall not be considered changed unless the child is enrolled and attends another school or is no longer enrolled in the previous school.
- B. School attendance MUST be documented indicating enrollment for the current academic year, including the physical location of the school, with EITHER:
 - 1. Official/Certified school enrollment record dated prior to October 1, 2015; OR
 - 2. School issued report card or performance record dated prior to October 1, 2015

AND

A Little League school attendance form completed by the principal, assistant principal, or administrator

Penalties for False Residency Statements or Documentation: Players and their parents/quardians are advised that a false statement of residence or school attendance may lead to ineligibility to play Little League Baseball. Under NO circumstances does ANY person have the authority to grant a waiver that allows a child to play in a local Little League program IN ANY DIVISION, when that child does not qualify under these eligibility requirements.
