Please initial next to each below to assure you understand what is expected at WBLL:

- Your actions as a volunteer are a reflection of you, your players, their families, and the league. Our players and program can only be as good as the quality of our coaches and managers. _____
- Be on time. Communicate and know what you are teaching _____
- Under no circumstances should there be swearing coming from anyone including the parents in the stands and players on your team _____
- Under no circumstances shall any volunteer, player or parent argue with league officials including the umpires. _____
- The manager is the only person allowed to question a call with an umpire _____
- Your badge is to be worn at ALL times while on the field or in the cage. If it is not, you are subjected to be removed from that game or practice. _____
- Follow all the rules that apply to your division. Get familiar with the rules on free downloaded app before the start of the season. _____
- Make sure everyone has proper league approved gear and no equipment is damaged. Gear that is not league approved or gear that is damaged cannot be in the dugout _____
- Make your practices fun but competitive. Do not do the same drills repetitively. Vary your routine, split up your team into smaller groups to assure you are maximizing their time during practices. And try to avoid your players just standing around. _____
- Coach with Class. Look out for the best interests of your players and the players on the other team.

In the end this organization is for the players you are coaching. WBLL exists to enable children to play regulation baseball. It does not exist to cater to the egos of Managers, Coaches or parents. Do right by the children you are overseeing. Be a role model that you would want your child to look up to. Strive to be better every day. There is always room for improvement. And embrace ideas, suggestions, and concerns from other coaches from your team. Our end goal is for these children to come back next season and every other season until they are aged out.
