DIAMOND LEADER

- Little League Diamond Leader coach training is open
 - www.LittleLeague.org/DiamondLeader
- FREE, 20–25-minute session for managers and coaches (and other volunteers)
- Will be required for tournament team managers and coaches for 2023
 - Course MUST be completed PRIOR to individual being named a tournament team manager/coach
- One time only completion needed
- Database to be available to leagues and districts before tournament season
- DAs can determine a policy to if or how they will verify for tournament play
 - Leagues are required to ensure they have completed the course
 - Policy should be shared in advance of tournament and ideally in May

COURSE WORK

- In addition to Diamond Leader course, Little League has been softly rolling out other course work
- Current two regular season course, Prepare and Play are available
 - League and district officials can sign up for these course now
- Tournament courses coming in Early May
 - DAs, ADAs, league officials and others should use these courses to help prepare for tournament
- Will officially roll out in September, but using time now to evaluate the courses and gather feedback
- There is a goal to get 25% leagues, per Region to complete Prepare and Play courses

SOFTBALL UPDATES

- Softball only expansion email (from Matt on 4/5)
 - If you had one or more league that chartered no softball teams in past 2 years
- Encourage leagues offering softball to expand softball offerings beginning in the Fall (pitching instruction, clinics, etc.)
- Identify individual(s) on district staff to make softball only boundary adjustment proposals
 - A league's map can be different per sport
- Softball tournament experience improvements and considerations

DATE PLANNING AND REMINDERS

- Share you projected district tournament dates NOW with your leagues
- Begin to plan when you will be reviewing tournament affidavits and documentation
 - Provide yourself enough time to thoroughly review and for leagues to make corrections
 - Must be reviewed before team's first game
 - Any player that does not meet the residency or school attendance requirements, must be removed from team and affidavit before first game
 - Player can be added to team in documentation is acceptable after team's first game
 - No exceptions that would allow a player to play in game while documentation is not in order

DATE PLANNING AND REMINDERS

- May 15 tournament team announcement date and when tryouts can start
- June 1 last day to charter (regular season) and make regular season team number adjustments
- June 1 all waivers, combined teams and interleague play applications must be submitted and approved
- June 1 outstanding balances to Little League must be paid in full (excludes tournament enrollment fees)
- June 15 deadline to enroll in tournament
- June 20 district tournament schedules must be shared (or two weeks before start of play if earlier)

FIELD AND SITE REVIEW

- Review ALL possible tournament sites NOW
- Measure all distances at sites, do not assume
 - Outfield fence distance
 - Pitching mound/rubber distance
 - Pitching mound height
 - Distance between bases
 - Distance from home plate to backstop
- Use our field checklist to gather distances and other information
 - Any site not meeting the minimum requirements can't be used
 - A waiver request could be made, but do not assume it will be approved
- Provide as many leagues as possible a chance to host games
- All hosting leagues must have approved safety (ASAP) plan

TOURNAMENT SCHEDULES

- District tournament schedules must be shared by June 20 or two weeks before play starts (whichever is earlier)
- Only approved methods can be used
 - Single elimination
 - Double elimination
 - Modified double elimination
 - Pool Play
- Pool play is not used to advance all teams
 - Must share how many teams will advance to elimination phase, if used
 - Elimination phase can be one of the elimination methods
- Teams are never seeded into brackets or pools
- Area tournaments are part of district play
- Must play games in order
 - Can start games as same time

TOURNAMENT COMBINATIONS

- Leagues can now submit to combine for tournament on the data center
- If approved for the regular season, it does not equal tournament approval
 - A tournament combo must be made
 - Deadline is June 1 to submit
- Separate request is needed for tournament level of play
- Only the host league, if approved, would enroll in tournament
- Leagues in the same district can submit a combination request
 - Or if outside of district, those that in a combination or interleague play can make a request

TOURNAMENT STREAMING

- For the international tournament games below Region-level, streaming is permitted
- Self-streaming, such as on YouTube or Facebook does not require a contract
 - Using a company or outside group will require a contract
- The Tournament Director will need to work with hosting league and that field's owner to ensure guidelines are followed
- Restricting spectators and parents and streaming as well as limiting locations of devices must be done in conjunction with league and property owner
- Teams must be made aware in advance of any streaming and on-site signage and announcements are strongly encouraged

SPORTSMANSHIP

- Would strongly encourage making sportsmanship a part of all tournament meetings and communications
- Use signage and announcements at games to encourage and promote sportsmanship
- Be intentional about your efforts and constantly talk about it
- Sportsmanship announcement is available from LittleLeague.org

TOURNAMENT EXPERIENCE

- Review all aspects of the tournament for possible enhancements, improvements and more
 - Keep in mind all players, not just the teams that win
 - How do you add value to the tournament?
 - How does the experience differ from other organizations and the regular season?
- Make a goal to include one tournament experience enhancement this year and add on in future years
- Remember all the tournament teams
 - This could be the only tournament experience for many kids
- Make the experience worth it

URBAN INITIATIVE PROGRAM

- We are working to grow the Urban Initiative Program
 - Both in leagues and knowledge of the program
- Urban Initiative leagues are part of an underserved community
 - Is a population that experiences inadequate access to essential goods, services, or opportunities.
 - This can be due to a variety of factors, including poverty, geographic isolation, language barriers, lack of access to transportation, and discrimination.
 - An underserved community may also be characterized by high rates of unemployment, low levels of educational attainment, and limited access to healthcare services.
 - The specific definition of an underserved community can vary depending on the context, but it generally refers to populations that face significant social, economic, or health-related disadvantages compared to other groups in the same area.

T-MOBILE HOME RUN DERBY

- T-Mobile Home Run Derby is back
- Free to host by leagues
 - Leagues receive a hosting kit
- Free to participate as well
 - For players 12 and under (League age)
 - Must be Little Leaguers
- Each district should work to ensure there is at least one local competition in their district this spring
- Leagues register online
