

Bay Soccer Club COVID-19 Protocols

Futsal-specific Protocols

- All spectators, players, coaches, officials, and staff must conduct daily symptom assessments.
 Anyone experiencing symptoms must stay home.
- Social distancing of 6 feet is mandatory, except for when in the court of play.
- Face coverings are required for coaches, officials, spectators, and staff at all times. Players must wear face coverings when not on the court of play (except for one of the reasons stated under the Governor's order for facial coverings throughout all of Ohio).
- Game schedules allow 10 minutes for families and players to exit game and 10 minutes for families and players to enter gyms.
 - Bay Soccer Club is asking families with players from 1st to 4th grade to limit spectator attendance to 2 spectators per player.
 - Bay Soccer is asking families with players from 5th to 8th grade to limit spectator attendance to 1 spectator per player.
 - Bleachers will be marked with designated areas to sit to allow for social distancing (spectator limit is subject to change).
 - Upon entrance of the facility, spectators will check in at the check-in table and tell the Bay Soccer Club volunteer whom they are there to watch. Spectators will receive a stamp on their hand once they check-in.
 - No congregating before, during, and after games. Spectators/players/coaches must leave the gym immediately after the completion of the game to allow ample time for the staff to clean and disinfect.
 - Players should bring a white and a blue shirt for team distribution. Bay Soccer Club will not be using pinnies.
- Hand sanitation stations will be placed throughout the facility.
- West outside doors of the Community Gym will be propped open to allow for adequate airflow.
- Staff will disinfect bathrooms, high touch surfaces, and bleachers during and in-between games using PureGreen24 and EnviroNQ disinfectant as well as disinfectant wipes.

Equipment and Accessories

- Players must have their own water bottle.
 - Players without water will not be allowed to take the field.
- Concessions will not be available.
- Hand sanitizer will be provided in various stations throughout the field layouts.
 - Players will be asked to bring their own hand sanitizer as well.
- Players must wash their hands or sanitize prior to each practice and match.
 - Prior to a match, hand sanitizing will take place during referee check-in of teams.
- Players must sanitize and/or wash their hands after each practice and match.
 - Recommend players shower immediately upon arrival at home after practice or match.



- No use of pinnies will be made available for multiple-player use.
- Players will be asked to bring multiple jerseys for use when needed.

Training Protocols (Travel, State League and Rec)

- Players, coaches and officials must conduct daily symptom assessments before each practice or game.
 - Symptom checker in a Google form will be sent for completion prior to each practice and game.
 - Anyone experiencing symptoms must stay home. According to the CDC, COVID-19 symptoms include fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, and diarrhea. This list does not include all possible symptoms. The CDC will continue to update symptoms as we learn more about COVID-19. - Players need to provide their own equipment:
 - Soccer balls
 - Water bottles
- Players who do not have their own equipment will not be allowed on the field.
- Equipment will be distanced from other players' equipment.
- Staggered training sessions to mitigate age groups on the fields at the same time.
- No congregating before or after practice.
 - Coaches, parents and players.
 - No parents will be allowed to be on or near the field during training (Travel/State League).
- All trainers and coaches must wear masks in accordance with state and local mandates.

Game Day Self-Assessment Check/COVID Screening

- Players, coaches and officials must conduct daily symptom assessments before each practice or game.
- Players, coaches and officials will conduct a symptom assessment before practicing or participating in a game.
- Symptom checker in a Google form will be sent for completion prior to each practice and game.
- Coaches will keep track of who attended each game.
- Anyone experiencing symptoms must stay home.
- If a player or a player's family member tests positive for COVID-19, they must notify:
 - bayrecsoccer@gmail.com

- All players who were exposed during a training or game will be notified of a positive result or a symptomatic participant.
- Player who has been exposed or tested as positive cannot return to play until:
 - A negative COVID-19 test is obtained.
 - 14 days have passed since the last positive test.



Match Play

- Provide spectator spacing lines six feet apart along the fields.
- Signage will be placed throughout venues as a reminder of:
 - State and local health department mandates (i.e., face covering required, must maintain physical distance of six feet)
- Players' benches: players should always maintain physical distancing of six feet on the sidelines; bench spacing will be painted on the sidelines by the Club.
 - Players who are 10 and older must wear face coverings when not engaged in play.
- Spectators:
 - Should be limited to one family member or loved one per player.
- All non-players must observe mask rules in accordance to the state and local mandates.
- Suspend handshakes prior to and following the match.
- Officials and coaches must wear masks in accordance with the state and local mandates.
- Extend the length of Match Day (historically 8:00 am to 12:00 noon) to ensure smaller groups of players and spectators are at the complex at the same time.
 - Staggered starts.
 - Staggered drop off and pick up times for those few parents/loved ones who did not stay to watch.
- Add port-a-potties to provide additional restroom facilities and reduce the number of individuals using the permanent facilities simultanteously.
- No referees will be allowed to congregate at the shed at any time.
 - Referees will stay socially distanced at all times when receiving their assignments or pay.
