

Ajax United Air Quality Index Policy

Our AQI Policy will serve our staff, volunteers, families, and coaches as a guide in relation to unsafe training and game playing conditions as it relates to the air quality. We will use the national standards as established by the EPA at www.airnow.gov

The scale is as follows :

Air Quality Index Levels of Health Concern	Numerical Value	Meaning
Good	0 to 50	Air quality is considered satisfactory, and air pollution poses little or no risk
Moderate	51 to 100	Air quality is acceptable; however, for some pollutants there may be a moderate health concern for a very small number of people who are unusually sensitive to air pollution.
Unhealthy for Sensitive Groups	101 to 150	Members of sensitive groups may experience health effects. The general public is not likely to be affected.
Unhealthy	151 to 200	Everyone may begin to experience health effects; members of sensitive groups may experience more serious health effects.
Very Unhealthy	201 to 300	Health warnings of emergency conditions. The entire population is more likely to be affected.
Hazardous	301 to 500	Health alert: everyone may experience more serious health effects

- Practices and games will be allowed between the 0-100 range.
- Practices and games may be canceled for players under 10 years old when air quality is between 100-149. Please contact your DOC if needed.
- Practices and games will be canceled for all ages when air quality is 150 or higher.
- Players who choose not to attend practices or games when the AQI is between 100-150 will not be penalized.
