

# **2017 CDAA Baseball** **12u Mid- Season Tournament Rules**

## **General Information:**

After each game the winning team must verify the score with the umpires and the umpire card will be used to update innings pitched per player as well as the standings/brackets.

Home team will be determined by pre-game coin flip with Head Coaches and Umpire.

## **Rules for the tournament:**

Age-appropriate House League Rules will govern with the following exceptions/clarifications:

### **1. Extra Innings:**

- a. For the 6<sup>th</sup> inning and all innings after, the run limit is increased to 10 per inning.
- b. A game that goes into extra innings and is still tied at the time limit (no inning to start after 1 hr. 45 min. from start of game), the League Coordinator or Tournament Director makes the final decision as to when to end the game. Every effort will be made to determine the outcome of the game on the field, but due to time restrictions, if the game should end in a tie, the score will revert back to the previous inning's score, when one team held a lead.

### **2. Playing Time –**

- a. No player may play the same position for more than 3 innings in consecutive games, with the exception of Pitcher. A player may pitch in a maximum of 2 innings per game and no more than 6 innings for the tournament. Pitcher is considered an infield position.
- b. The batting order can be changed prior to the tournament. The continuous batting order rule from House League Rules shall start back up the 1st game played in the tournament and throughout the tournament and the end of the season.

### **3. Base Running –**

- a. Base runners may lead off two steps off the base. TWO STEPS for the Mid-Season tournament.
- b. Base runners may attempt to steal after the ball leaves the pitcher's hand. A runner leaving early will be called out.

## **Unsportsmanlike conduct will not be tolerated!**

Any player, coach or spectator ejected from a game for unsportsmanlike conduct will not be allowed at any tournament fields for the remainder of the tournament.

Unsportsmanlike conduct is the call of the umpires and/or tournament director or league coordinator whose decision is final.
