

How do you decide your child's path?



Criteria	Considerations
Positioning for High School	Seek exposure to high school coaches
Competitiveness	 Talent level of the team and competition is important (tournaments and regular season schedule)
Training Curriculum / Coaching	Seek high quality coaching / instruction
Travel Distance	 Practices and games (divisional and tournaments)
Postponing Sports Specificity	 Clubs require more practices and higher winter commitment Ability to continue Lacrosse, Dance, Baseball/Softball, Basketball
Cost	Club solutions can be 2-3x the cost of travel
Community	Town only vs. mix of regional players

WSA Enhanced Offering





- Alignment and connectivity between SHS and WSA programs
- Weekly optional training session on Mondays run by Barry (GSocc HC), Russ (BSocc HC) and staff,
- Available to all U11+ players rostered on a WSA travel team
- Focused on skills development and talent identification



2 Enhanced WSA BLUE

- Potential to flex up into a premier league (EDP) schedule based on the level of the team
- Potential for additional tournaments
- Increased exposure to HS coaches
- Team continuity.
- Kelvin Mutambo and Jake Zuniga intended to coach U11BB and U11GB, respectively

3 WSA / Staples Soccer Alliance

- Comprised of WSA board members, Mickey Kydes and Staples High School Varsity coaches (i.e., Russ and Barry)
- Objective: to monitor and enhance connectivity in real time during the Fall and Spring seasons
- Assess this pilot year; plan medium- to long-range opportunities for ongoing Staples High School-WSA partnership.

Why now?



• SHS Coaching:

• Staples High School head coaches are **excited to see upcoming WSA talent**; can offer insights into high school pathways / premier clubs.

• MKS:

• Uniquely positioned to support Westport players given the strength and reputation of MKS.

Talent Level

• Our U9 and U10 programs are consistently deep; we want players to see a future for themselves at WSA.

Increased Parent Interest

 Over the past two years, Westport parents have expressed interest for a stepped up/more competitive option to club

Earlier Spring Tryout Dates for Fall 2024 U11+ Teams

- Spring Tryout Dates (for Fall 2024)
 - UPDATED: Wed 4/24 and Fri 4/26
 - WSA will share this info via email this week

• Why?

- Our new tryout dates are being scheduled on or around the same time frame as club tryouts.
- The goal of syncing up with club tryouts is to help parents and their players to be able to **make** informed decisions in real time.

Note:

• MKS coaches may hold a couple of roster spots on each team to allow for **flexibility where needed** at the end of the spring season.



Anticipated Costs

 Participation in the enhanced program will have additional costs on top of WSA's current travel tuition.

- Fees are still being finalized, and will depend on a player's participation.
 - Staples Soccer Skills Training only (open to all U11+)
 - ±\$200 per season
 - Enhanced WSA Blue only (premier league + add'l tournaments)
 - ±\$450 per year
 - Both options
