



FCKLL Fall 2021 Family and Player Safety Guidelines

FCKLL executed safe and successful seasons in the Fall of 2020 and Spring of 2021, and will continue to follow state, local, and Center for Disease Control (CDC) Guidance regarding COVID-19 safety.

Parents, players, and fans must follow all current and future guidance from the League. Players must comply with the rules to be eligible to play. This guidance is subject to change and is current as of August 16, 2021.

Rules for Fall 2021 Season

- FCKLL is following all Virginia COVID-19 guidelines, and requires players and families to do the same, as a requirement of participation.
- Parents/guardians must sign a COVID waiver before any player begins the season's baseball activities. This happens during registration.
- While day-of event screenings are not required, parents/guardians must keep their player home from practice or games if they're feeling sick or have any symptoms of COVID-19, and get a test if the doctor recommends.
- While masks/face coverings are not required for outdoor FCKLL activities, players and volunteers are welcome to wear a mask when on or off the field.
- Players should bring labeled personal sports equipment, water bottle, and hand sanitizer.
- Players may sit in the dugout or spread out outside the fence, at the discretion of the Manager.
- Spectators may sit in the bleachers UNLESS the team is using a bleacher as their in-game seating.
- Everyone should wash hands frequently.
- No spitting, eating, touching, or high-fives. "Hat tips" take the place of post-game handshakes.
- Parents/guardians must report to the Manager and FCKLL Safety Team if a player or tests positive for COVID, within 4 hours.
- Parents/guardians must report to the Manager and FCKLL Safety Team if anyone in the household tests positive, or if the player is placed under quarantine due to possible exposure, within 12 hours.

Going Forward

The League will continue to monitor and implement Virginia and CDC guidance.
