Summary: The Cupertino Reds enjoyed a combined stellar outing by starting pitcher Shaurya Jain and reliever Rowan Gutierrez to ease past the Mountain View Athletics by a final tally of 6-1 at Kennedy Middle School in Cupertino on Wednesday, June 8th in a Juniors TOC matchup. Cupertino jumped out to an early lead in the bottom of the 1st inning when Jeffrey Chong led off the inning with single, advanced to third thanks to a throwing error and subsequent balk, and came around to score on an RBI groundout by Jihoo Wan.

Cupertino's lead was short-lived, however, as Mountain View evened the score at 1-1 in the top of the 2nd inning when Alex Sykora walked, stole second, took third on a balk, and then scored on a passed ball. The A's starting pitcher Sal Soto preserved the stalemate in the home half of the 2nd inning, needing only 7 pitches to record an efficient 1-2-3 inning.

But Gutierrez was equal to the challenge when he took the ball from Jain in the top of the 3rd and stifled the A's offense for the rest of the game, scattering 5 hits over 5 innings with 2 strikeouts. Meanwhile, the Reds would add to their advantage in the bottom of the 3rd thanks to runs by Chong and catcher Sam Satake, the latter thanks to a sac fly RBI by Jain. Chong and Satake would partner in the bottom of the 5th to pad the Reds' lead with Chong scoring on an RBI double by Satake. The big hit of the inning was delivered by Gutierrez, who helped his own cause by plating Jain and Satake with an RBI single to add some insurance runs for Cupertino.

Mountain View's Makaio Mo'unga worked a 1-2-3 bottom of the 6th to position the A's for a dramatic comeback but Cupertino returned the favor in the top of the seventh as Gutierrez set the side down in order to finish the game. Gutierrez notched the win for his efforts while Soto took the loss despite allowing only 4 hits in 4 innings of work.
