JT opened meeting at 6:10 PM.

Minutes from July 16 meeting reviewed and approved.

Several parents from the public attended this open meeting.

Parent from East Butler: son plays on SABA 8U all-star – wants his son to have a "fair shot" at evaluations and not be an alternate due to residence – requesting to be "grandfathered" in, since he has been playing with SABA for the past 3 years – East Butler didn't have a program for a while which led this family to SABA – advocated for his son "he's respectful and a good teammate; has had a lot of kid pitch experience" – younger son will likely play for East Butler, as they will likely have an established organization – will be 9U next spring

- May be a conflict with the ARL for in-house, as ARL does not permit out of community ball players; shouldn't affect travel ball
- This child would make player 13
- During evaluations, this child was not near the "cut line"

Open discussion about proposed rule change -

- May be an option for parents to make 1 choice at the beginning of starting SABA and then not consecutive years
- MH: the idea is to create a policy that will be fair and allow for the development of players while allowing them to gain more enjoyment; section 8 bylaws "all star tourney play - placed at grade regardless of age" this is forcing kids to play with older kids – MH proposes age-based concept with giving parents the option of playing with grade – kids born after April 30 they're less confident/less physically developed leading to lower confidence, less developed; we currently do pre-season and post season evaluations – with the 12 kids that played last year who are playing grade level but are under the April 30 date: bronco and minor had 45 kids in each group- bronco had 5 kids playing up and they placed towards the bottom in evaluations; minor has 7 kids playing up and they also were evaluated at the lower end; 15 kids is "ideal" for middle school – none of these kids rank in the top 15, meaning none of these kids will likely play middle school ball because they're likely to get cut; there are other kids playing AAU baseball that would rank higher, pushing these kids lower – grade rule isn't working; 8U team 2024 – no kids played up (all age appropriate); 8U team this year had 3.5 kids that played up and they only averaged 1 extra base hit per game; age based= increase playing time, enjoyment, skill development, play more significant positions, higher in batting order, retain more players; other leagues: Little League, Cal Ripken, Pony, all go age based (butler, freeport, Seneca valley, mars, north hills, etc. all age based); proposal: vote to take place today; need transition plan; we can't really change the situation for the current players - kids that are grandfathered in would stick with grade-

based rules and stay with existing all-star teams (too much change); age based eligibility would begin with 7U team coming up; if 7U player makes the decision to play with 2nd graders/parents commit then they will be considered in that age group for the rest of their time in KYB; farm commissioner would have to communicate with the families that have to make this choice (typically 2-3 kids/year); grandfathered in means you've been here playing with organization for several years; if not grandfathered in, then fall into new proposal rules (age based)

- Parent: question we play with 9U but we're not grandfathered in; where do we play; there wasn't a 10U team; how do you make a choice; age eligible for 9U where does he play?; if choose to stay with grade then that wipes out 10U next year due to not enough kids
- Parent: two kids played down so there could be a team; not fair if these 2 kids are forced to play with next age group up and new kids coming in have the choice; only 10 signed up for 11U
- MH: data shows it wasn't a good choice to move to grade based in 2021; need to look at the future of the organization; I wish there was a great opportunity for everyone, but don't know that there is a sweeping league wide option; if 24 kids are at 10U group, it's not going to be 12 and 12, so may be a team with 14 kids; we can't say at the moment everyone gets to choose
- Parent: can't you say current players are grandfathered in and they get to choose
- JH: travel ball is a privilege not a right we need to separate from rec ball; we mix the two too much and we shouldn't
- Parent: seems like all of this is done to accommodate one family
- MH: not the case accommodating all kids because when you're young and forced to play against older kids success isn't guaranteed
- CW: 2021 the grade-based vote was sold to him due to what other teams were doing at that time; we need to separate rec ball and travel ball; child has to MAKE the team/meet a certain performance level; we need to take a look at particular situations; don't want to make constant exceptions;
- MH: team balance and roster needs (current proposal) this will be looked at; better for the health of the league if we have an 11 U team; losing a team is not the goal
- CW: every division has to have a team that's the goal
- AS: we have to look at 2 things: changing rule for the benefit of all kids in KYB benefitting this years kids and all succeeding kids; a few kids may need to have exceptions; in order to make it work for everyone, we should look at making exceptions; doesn't seem like we're setting our kids up for fair competition if we're going by grade when all other organizations go by age
- CW: need to look at the future so we're in line with everyone else; whatever helps keep kids here, playing KYB baseball, is the priority; we don't want kids leaving KYB; we want to put quality teams on the field
- JT: allowing a choice every year would cause turmoil
- JB: maybe have the option to try out for both ages

- Parent: we bonded with the players and parents so don't really want to break apart
- AS: everyone should be able to play; enough teams for all; change at first seems hard, but sometimes we need to give it a chance
- JB: shouldn't force to play up with their grade if they're more comfortable playing down
- Parent: what if someone new comes into organization
- Board: then they get to pick
- JT: we have current wording in bylaws that we can use to apply to this new proposal
- Parent: past 2-3 years, child had to play up with grade and he struggled we left KYB and he played with older kids and was at bottom of line up, struggled, scared, intimidated, kids bigger; last year we kept him down and he was batting 1st-5th; when he dropped with kids his age, he exceled; not here to make friends, here to make a ball team
- CW: goal to keep kids here and bring back kids that left to filter to JV/Varsity; our job to make it competitive
- Parent: son is playing up and he is getting better; makes him better

Fall ball registration closed Monday evening

All-stars are wrapped up; maybe 1-2 still planning something

TREASURER'S REPORT – Tom McDougall (TM) reported:

JT: no significant withdrawals or incoming money

\$12000 still needs paid out to Penn Fencing

Some incoming for concessions

AS: can Tom provide a total of all money spent this year so it can be included in letter to sponsors; help the cause of asking for support; need to work this into information being dispersed to sponsors and families

JT: no update

FIELD MAINTENANCE - Josh Harbison (JH) reported:

JH: may need some chalk for fall ball; field dry is good; need to get CUB's tire back on – may need to take to Stan's

CW: are we still looking at seeding, plugging, rolling, weed & feed for the fall; could we reach out to businesses about borrowing equipment (either to league/parents or businesses)

JT: no update

WEB/IT/SOCIAL MEDIA – Zak Sobotka (ZS) reported:

ZS: 125 final fall ball numbers

<u>SPONSORSHIP – Angie Shoop (AS) reported:</u>

AS: bar bingo: talked to Xtra innings and they are still doing them; owner is getting back to AS with possible dates; November would be hard, but should pursue early December, if this works for owner.

Dicks 20% off is next weekend (15th-18th) at Butler and Cranberry

<u>LEGION/SENIOR COMMISSIONER – Jamie McSwaney (JM) reported:</u>

JT: no update, but JM and CW did a lot of work on legion field; team also got involved and did work

COLT COMMISSIONER – Jamie McSwaney (JM) reported:

JT- no update

PONY COMMSSIONER - Curtis Walbert (CW) reported:

CW: field looks good; team of 13-14 kids; Alex will coach again; email from someone that wants to sign up late – CW will reach out to this family; within ARL; CW can help with practices

Games will start week of Labor Day; practices likely to begin mostly on Legion field but not sure when

BRONCO COMMISSIONER - John VanLenten (JVL) reported:

JVL: fall ball will have 2 teams; Mars projecting 1 team, may need to engage CT also; not sure who Bronco CT contact person is; practice to start week of 8/18; looking to have all kids practice together 1x/week to build fundamental skills; 8/10 evaluations; 11U losing 3 kids so looking to fill these positions

MINOR COMMISSIONER – Mike Hedglin (MH) reported:

MH: had evaluation for 9U earlier this week. Another scheduled for this Sunday for kids that couldn't make it. Roster created, but not yet sent to coaches. Practices start week of 8/18. Games start week of Labor Day. Coordinating with Mars and CT; minor field will get back stop done next week; wants to get steps poured after back stop completed; grass will need cut; 3 teams for minor: Rinamin, Bogan, and Torrez are coaches

FARM COMMISSIONER - Joe Brose (JB) reported:

JB: 35 kids, 3 teams: Tucek, Protz; playing with Freeport and will meet within the next week to create schedule; East Butler reached out, but not sure if going to work with them; practice starting week of 8/18 having 3 practices before Labor Day; evals for 7U are almost done; 8U evals are complete; 7U done with tourneys: second place x1; 8U had one second place out of 5 tourneys;

T-BALL COMMISSIONER - Cory Tucek (CT) reported:

CT: 9U has 1-2 more tourneys; shut-out #1 seed in last tourney; making progress; t-ball have 22 kids signed up, but 1-2 kids may be added; 4 teams potentially; St. Lukes is good to go with us next year; in process of getting grass cleaned off infield; goal to get field as maintenance-free as possible; if go without a season, hope to only have to do bare minimum work to get up to par; may reach out to some companies to see if someone can donate sand; need to replace storage box, as it is a hazard – need to have something to store rakes, etc. for field maintenance; may need new trash can vs. not having a trash can (since there isn't a concession stand)

VICE PRESIDENT – Steve Tuzikow (ST) reported:

JT: no update from ST; but got fall ball practice balls ordered; he's been moving along with all-star evaluations

New Business Not Noted Elsewhere & Open Forum:

JH: for home tourneys – if parents and the team make food items, does KYB keep profit?

NO – because concession is the only thing that generates profit from all-star teams; team gets percentage of sales; team only makes full profit off entry fees; KYB might only be breaking even based on the percentage we give to tourney/All Star team; JH disagrees due to money coming in for sign-ups, and concession throughout the year

AS: Brad-mar pine – has separate food from regular concessions; would it be easier to separate food items?; may need to adjust prices, look at profit margin; 7U team – because we didn't have fryers and didn't have items to sell so we should consider giving that team more money; JT: we did order pizza out of KYB funds to sell since there weren't fryer items

Board vote on new age-based proposal:

Board unanimously voted to adopt the age-based proposal STARTING WITH 7U.

Board members voted 8-2 to allow for choice for all other players that are impacted by this change during this transition year (email to be sent to all affected):

Board vote on East Butler player that has been playing for KYB for 3 years to be grandfathered in. Vote was unanimous.
