- ► US Club Birth Year Registration
 - Long-Term Development is the focus; shifts focus away from team and onto individual player



- ▶ US Club Requirements
 - ► All players and volunteers must register at GGFSC.com first
 - US Club uses GotSoccer for national registration system
 - Username is the email address you use for your primary account at ggfsc.com
 - Compliance
 - All compliance is done electronically if you are not fully compliant, you cannot receive a player or volunteer card and YOU WILL NOT BE ABLE PARTICIPATE
 - Instructions to be sent in the next week may begin fulfilling requirements after that
 - Compliance season runs August 1 thru July 31st all previous entries were reset when US Club adopted the new system in April 2021
 - Everybody is responsible for their (or their kids) own compliance entries - GGFSC cannot provide this



- ► US Club Requirements
 - Compliance Requirements (cont'd)
 - Players
 - ▶ Disqualification Review takes 1-2 business days
 - Form R-002 (release)
 - Headshot (update every two years)
 - Birth Verification (only once in new system) takes 2-3 business days
 - Coaches, Managers, all adult players and volunteers
 - Headshot
 - Background check (takes 5-7 business days)
 - SafeSport
 - Disqualification review (takes 1-2 business days)
 - ▶ Birth verification (adult players only takes 2-3 business days)

- US Soccer Birth-Year Philosophy
 - ▶ In 2016, US Soccer changed from school-year age cutoff to birth-year
 - For instance, teams are expected to be comprised of players born in 2010, or 2005, 2009, etc.
 - ► This creates some unexpected divisions for those used to Rec or school soccer where classmates are usually grouped together
 - It is important to understand how these divisions are mandated across the board in competitive soccer and detect and overcome the feelings of disparity that might occur
 - For instance, a fourth grader born January-July 2012 may see other fourth grade classmates born Aug-Dec 2011 "playing up" with fifth graders while they play with third graders
 - Those fourth graders born Aug-Dec 2011 may feel like they're playing with fifth graders and are in the minority - may not feel like they fit in
 - A player may never "play down" this is strictly enforced by GGFSC, each tournament, and even the referees
 - ▶ These are growth opportunities! Please help manage expectations



- Player Movement
 - Every year is always a "numbers game"
 - Max and minimum roster sizes are dictated by US Club, each tournament, and GGFSC targets, set by the DoC
 - Soccer is unique in that on-field player numbers and roster sizes get bigger as the years go on, all the way up to U13
 - However, the number of registered players in each age group usually attrites as age increases.
 - ► This means we run into unfilled rosters and odd combinations as ages increases one or two players can make a HUGE difference
 - Occasionally players are moved up according to roster needs, but this is the exception rather than the rule
 - Sometimes age groups are combined when conditions dictate
 - Players moved or combined in one year are not entitled to movement in subsequent years - although we would like to have the numbers to support the notion, there are no "permanent teams"

- U13 GIRLS [2009]: 1 team, 14 players + 1 guest player. Receiving 2 U12 players.
- U14 GIRLS [2008]: 1 team, 11 players + 1 guest player. KEEP RECRUITING.
- U15 GIRLS [2007]: 1 team, 15 players. 1 player move to U16.
- U16 GIRLS [2006]: 1 team, 12 players. Receiving 1 player from U15. Needs to utilize guest players. KEEP RECRUITING.
- U17/U18 GIRLS [2004-05]: 1 team, 13 players + 1 guest player.

- U8/U9 BOYS [2013-14]: 3 teams, 10 players each
- U10 BOYS [2012]: 1 team, 10 players. 2 players move to U11.
- U11 BOYS [2011]: 1 team, 13 players. Receiving 2 players from U10.
- U12 BOYS [2010]: 1 team, 13 players.
- U13/U14 BOYS [2008-09]: 1 team, 17 players. Move 8 players to U15.
- U15 BOYS [2007]: 1 team, 17 players. Receive 8 players from U14.
- U16/U17 BOYS [2005-06]: 1 team, 13 players.
