Field Usage News

INSTRUCTIONAL: All **U-6 and U-7** games are at New Market on Saturday mornings—Training by USA will be at Green Acres. Coaches can have additional practices at New Market as they wish. Coaches, Please lock up the goals at New market after use.

All **U-8 and above** games are at Green Acres. Training for instructional with USA will be at Green Acres on Field 18. Additional practices can be at green acres (but not on the playing fields) or New Market. Lights are being set up.

TRAVEL: All Travel training will be at the **Green Acres** fields. Practices may also be held at Witherspoon. Game fields will be at Green acres and the middle school fields at Conackmack. Fields will be dictated by the schedule.

All playing fields are off limits. Other school properties are available for use on weekends during light.

Piscataway Soccer Club & Elks Soccer Shoot Out!!!

A Soccer Shoot Out event will be held on **Friday, September 19,** at the PHS Turf Field at 7:00. **Check in time starts at 6:30**. The event is open to all children up to U14 (ages 13 and under), whether or not currently in the Soccer Club. Come on out and check it out. Invite your friends who may not be in the club too. The Grand Lodge Youth Activities Committee of the Elks intends to bring every Elks State Association on board and increase participation in soccer on every level. The Elks Program includes a Local, District and State Shoot Out. The Elks work with local Soccer Associations and Recreation Departments to increase Elk participation. **Thanks again to John and Maureen Chapman for running such a great event.** The Soccer Shoot Out program consists of two different contests that test different level skills at different ages: The "Five Goal Contest" consists of a series of five goals, decreasing in size from 48 inches to 17 inches. The age groups that use these goals are divided into two categories; a U-8 group that contains all ages seven years old and younger and a U-10 group that contains ages eight and nine. The contest is open to boys and girls, who will shoot separately. The U-8 contestants kick from 15 feet from the face of the goal, while the U-10 contestants kick from 18 feet from the goal.

The Grid Goal Contest consists of a full-size goal sectioned off so points can be scored when the ball is kicked into certain sections. The age groups that use this goal are U-12, which contain the ages ten and eleven, and U-14, which contain ages twelve and thirteen. The contest is open to both boys and girls, who will shoot separately.

Winners at this Local Shoot Out will advance onto the Elks District Level. The Piscataway High School Athletic Booster Club will open the Concession Stand with a limited menu of Hot Dogs, Pretzels, Hot and Cold Drinks for your purchase if you so desire.....

Background Checks

As a requirement for coaching with the club, all coaches, whether instructional or traveling, are required to fill out the Kid Safe form, as well as filling out an on-line E7 background check. The form is used to complete and cross check with back ground checks. All information requested on Kid Safe forms must be filled in. If it is not completed, you will not be able to coach. All those who have done the check **after September 2011, do not need to do again**.

The information will be kept confidential with one board member only assigned to review the findings before the records are deleted. Please go to. It may say 2009-2010, but disregard if it does. You will be forwarded a link by your respective Vice Presidents once all names are confirmed for the Fall 2014 season.

Coaches Licenses

The Piscataway Soccer Club requires all coaches to obtain at least an "F" License to coach an instructional team and in travel, age U-10 and below. **Head coaches in travel U11 and up must have at the minimum an E license.** This United States Soccer Federation sanctioned "F" classes are recommended for coaching youth soccer from ages 6-11. The F license class is a nine-hour class (three hours lecture on Friday night and six hours of field play on Sunday in this case). It is important that all people coaching for the soccer club take the class. The cost of the course typically is around \$35 and will be reimbursed to members of the Piscataway Soccer Club upon completion of the class. *Registration must be done through the NJ Youth Soccer web site listed below.* If you have obtained the F-license and are looking for more training or are coaching older children, it is recommended you to take the E-license course. Since February 2007, the PSC also requires all those coaching traveling teams U-11 and up to obtain the E-license. The E-license is an 18-hour course held over 2 weekends in a similar format to the F-license. The E-license is \$75, but upon completion you will be reimbursed by the club. If you would like to take either the F or E-license course, you may find a class location by visiting either www.njyouthsoccer.com/coaching/fsched.htm or www.njyouthsoccer.com/coaching/fsched.htm or www.njyouthsoccer.com/coaching/fsched.htm or www.njyouthsoccer.com/coaching/esched.htm Registration must be done through the NJ Youth Soccer web site listed above, even for those classes hosted at Piscataway High.

Interested in reffing or having your child ref traveling games? Go to **www.mnjysa.org** or **www.njrefs.com** and look for referee course information for entry

level grade 8 referee classes. You must be at least 16 years to take the reffing class. Please keep checking the website to see if any classes are added to the current list and **look for information on the club website.** However, if you have done traveling soccer and know the rules,

you can ref instructional games. Please contact Brian Hinds if you are interested. If you get your reffing license and ref instructional, there is a bonus pay.
