Refing Info

The Piscataway Soccer Club is looking for youth players who are 12 years old or older, to become Referees and work PSC Recreation games on Saturday mornings.

- Get a greater understanding of the laws of the game. This will help make you to be a better/smarter player.
- Get paid \$30 per game as Center Ref (\$15 for Assistant Refs)
- Free Referee Uniform and Whistle,
- Youth Referees will be mentored by Brian Hinds, a current referee with lots experience.

Any new prospective ref needs to sign up for a new referee class for one day and then attend an on the field class on another day. Grade 9,8, and 7 refs will all be known as Grassroots refs. New refs can now start this process at age 13 now.

Pride U10 Girls

From fears of not having a team in the summer to finishing the season undefeated, the PSC U10 Pride has undergone quite a journey in the Fall 2025 season. Last season, Spring 2025, the team finished with 10 defeats, an arduous experience for the players, families, and coaches. Additionally, in the summer, there was a fear the team may not exist as several players left Pride. However, the team remained steadfast to the course and organized joint scrimmage games with the U14 Fire, gaining valuable experience in playing against older girls. Additionally, with the support of PSC Administration, specifically Chuck Myers, the team was able to recruit 3 new players onto the team, each of whom played a vital role in Pride's success: Olivia Blath (defense), Hailey Perello Soria (forward), and Cameron Shilling (center midfielder), whose father, Alan Shilling also impactfully joined Pride's coaching staff. With a roster of 11 girls, Pride was ready to compete in Mid NJ Youth Soccer Association U10 Girls Flight 3. As the season went forward, the coaching staff was able to determine positions for each girl that would maximize their impact while also best serving the team. The rotation evolved into Goalies Julia Rivera, Rahi Shah, and Flora Sy; Defenders Olivia Blath, Harshika Killaru, Diya Ravipati, and Rahi Shah; Midfielders/Forwards Ellie Fisher, Ira Kasu, Niharika Sankar, Hailey Perello Soria, and Cameron Shilling. Ellie Fisher, Harshika Killaru, Julia Rivera, and Flora Sy showed their versatility in playing all over the field as needed.

Pride also adopted a team identity, as a team playing a high line with a lethal press, relying on the striker to create chaos, midfielders to keep the other's team defenders and midfield honest, and defenders who could protect the goal. As the season went forth, Pride was able to score 44 goals while only conceding 10 goals, while maintaining control of possession in every game. The season showed the Pride's adaptability and resilience as well when despite going a goal down, the team was able to come back and win. Each week, in addition to the impactful training sessions led by Red Bulls trainer Brian Lopes (whose patience with and guidance of the girls created an environment in which every girl could grow and develop), the Pride coaches also held an additional 30 minute practices on Wednesday to work on skills ranging from effective throw-ins with 3 options to pressing to building out masterfully from the back.

The Pride would also like to thank the families of the players who provided support which provided important in the team's success. From post-game snacks and drinks to cheering and instruction from the sidelines to a

post-game victory tunnel and so much more, the Pride families created a foundation for success.

Coaches Mickey Shah, Alan Shilling, and Jay Sy could not be more proud of the girls' progress this year and we are looking forward to playing in MidNJSA U10 Flight 2 next year.
