 - A. COVID-19 Update
 - 1. COVID has hit LSC hard. So much so, it affected Club Reserves
 - 2. We lost Summer seasons for both Travel and Rec
 - 3. Fortunately, we had a successful Fall season
 - 4. As of this time, limited cases and spread
 - 5. We continue to follow State and ISD194 Protocols
 - 6. Please keep kids with symptoms and/or exposure home and inform coaches!
 - B. Finance
 - 1. We took a \$109,397 loss, due to COVID
 - 2. The Club expends money on behalf of programs and hires contractors who that could not be shut off/let go during the pandemic. New contracts have updated verbiage in anticipation of problems.
 - 3. Loss of the Father's Day Cup was not too damaging, due to limited expenditures
 - 4. LSC had much larger refunds than most other clubs, with many offering only a club credit or no refund at all.
 - 5. Club Reserves were able to absorb the losses, but another poor year could be devastating

- 6. No increase in fees, except for the greatly expanding U11-12 levels because of their expanded programming
- 7. Indoor space, coaching and administrative contractors are the three largest expenses. Indoor space is the largest expense, at 23% of Travel costs
- 8. All programs are expected to cover their own internal expenses
- 9. Sponsorship by Twin Cities Orthopedics and Lakeville Orthodontics help to hold costs down. Support and thank our sponsors!
- 10. Camps continue to expand significantly
