1. We had a $\$ 80,861.63$ profit ( $7.17 \%$ ). This helped offset last year's loss due to Covid.
2. Only partial shutdowns due to Covid.
3. The rec program and the tournament help fund expenses.
4. Our expanding camps are vital to our revenue.
5. Some fees were adjusted this year. Certain select teams were increased to cover additional training, space, and coaching. Academy teams were increased to cover their costs.
6. Indoor space, coaching and administrative contractors are the three largest expenses.
7. All programs are expected to cover their own internal expenses
8. Sponsorship by Twin Cities Orthopedics and Lakeville Orthodontics help to hold costs down.

22. Referees, the nationwide shortage was felt especially at the rec level so we implemented a "Junior Referee" program to allow younger players to ref the rec program and it was hugely successful

Facility Updates, gained access to the updated Aronson Fields, have signed a contract with the new Lakeville Dome, reduced utilization of previously used domes, plans to construct dome at Lakeville South, and the city is offering a bond referendum which will add lighted soccer fields to the city fields
