- We will now be accepting credit cards (minimum $\$ 10$ purchase) on our NEW Square POS register system
- Bottle drinks - no more fountain soda
- 6 Family Meal Deals - to save you some money

- 4 New Drinks including Capri Sun - a healthier choice for your children
- 5 New Ice Cream Choices - including frozen bananas

We have listened to you and are doing everything we can to offer more choices for your refreshment needs, and hopefully speed up wait times along the way. We will still be making most of our hot foods on demand (when not busy). We have found that most of the hot foods that we sell, do not last very long under heat lamps. The longest wait time should be no more than 5 minutes (pizza) and mostly 3 to 4 minutes (everything else).
