Being born and raised in England, soccer is the number one sport.

What would you say was/is the biggest thing that helps when you play?

Giving my best effort at all times to the best of my ability.

Who is the biggest influence in your coaching career?

The players that I coach. They make you strive to do your best to give your knowledge to them so that they can do their best.

What's your favorite drill and why?

With the younger kids come up competition is always on their minds. I have a simple gates drill where two players pass and move through a series of "cone" gates. I time the runs and encourage each pair of players to do it faster and more accurately the next time through.

What is your best memory from coaching?

There are many, but they are typically when you see a player use a skill during a game and be successful.

I also admired [English striker] Gary Lineker during his playing career. To my knowledge he never once received a yellow or red card, an unbelievable achievement!


Who's your favorite professional soccer team and why?
