### 1. Cold Weather Policy

- If the feels-like temperature (including wind chill) is 36°F or below, training and games may be modified (shortened sessions, more breaks, increased warm-ups) or canceled at the discretion of club officials.
- If the **feels-like temperature** is **32°F or below**, all outdoor soccer activities are **canceled**.
- Players should wear appropriate cold-weather gear, including gloves, hats, layers under uniforms, and warmups. No exposed skin for U12 and younger at 32°F or below.
- Goalkeepers may wear gloves at all times.

#### 2. Hot Weather Policy (Using WBGT Guidelines)

PRAA follows **Wet Bulb Globe Temperature (WBGT) guidelines**, which consider **temperature**, **humidity**, **sun exposure**, **and wind speed** for accurate heat safety monitoring. WBGT readings will be taken using a weather app or device before each session.

WBGT Reading	PRAA Hot Weather Policy
Under 82°F	Normal play; hydration encouraged.
82°F – 86.9°F	Mandatory 2-minute water breaks every 25 minutes. Coaches encourage hydration
87°F – 89.9°F	Mandatory 4-minute water breaks every 20 minutes; reduce intensity; players may remove shin guards during breaks.
90°F – 92°F	Modify or shorten sessions, mandatory 5-minute water breaks every 15 minutes; increased substitutions; no goalkeeper gloves unless medically necessary.
Above 92°F	All outdoor soccer activities are canceled.

- Players should pre-hydrate before sessions and continue hydrating after play.
- Coaches and referees must monitor for **heat-related illness symptoms** (dizziness, nausea, excessive sweating, confusion).
- Shade and cooling areas should be available whenever possible.

### 3. Lightning & Severe Weather Policy

PRAA uses Perry Weather lightning detection systems at Hemby Bridge Elementary and Chestnut Square Park to ensure player safety.

- If the Perry Weather alarm sounds, ALL players, coaches, and spectators must evacuate the field immediately and seek shelter in a fully enclosed building or vehicle.
- You may not return to the field until the Perry Weather system timer has expired and the all-clear alarm sounds.
- You can track the real-time countdown at www.praasoccer.com.
- If a tornado warning or severe thunderstorm warning is issued, all activities are immediately canceled.
- Coaches may end practice earlier if lightning is detected in the area before an alarm sounds.

# 4. Decision-Making & Communication

- The Club Field Coordinator or Club Officials will make cancellation decisions as early as possible and notify teams via email, text, or the club app.
- Coaches have the authority to **modify** training sessions for safety but must follow club guidelines.
- Referees have final say on game-day weather decisions, but club policies should be followed.
