

CENTRAL CHESTERFIELD LITTLE LEAGUE DISCIPLINARY POLICY

Central Chesterfield Little League (CCLL) and Little League International (LLI) expect all managers and coaches to exhibit acceptable behavior on and off the field, while on the property of any county property or Local League parks. Aggressive behavior (fighting, pinching, hitting, or other acts of aggression) or other unacceptable behavior (foul language, restricted substances, or any other offensive behavior on the playing field) will not be tolerated. Participants involved in unacceptable behavior of this type will be subject to disciplinary action as dictated by LLI and Chesterfield County Policy. The CCLL Board of Directors (BOD) reserves the right to set a penalty according to the seriousness of the offense, up to and including suspension from participation in any CCLL-related activity. The ruling of the CCLL Board of Directors will be final.

It is the sincere hope of the CCLL staff and its members that no participant will display any form of unacceptable behavior; however, should the situation arise, this disciplinary policy will be enforced. ALL participants involved in unacceptable behavior will be disciplined on an individual basis as determined by the guidelines established by LLI and as applied by the CCLL Disciplinary Committee.

Little League International - Rule 4.07 -When a manager, coach, or player is ejected from a game, they shall leave the field immediately and take no further part in that game. They may not sit in the stands and may not be recalled. Any manager, coach, or player ejected from a game must not be present at the game site for the remainder of that game. Any manager, coach, or player ejected from a game is suspended for his or her team's next physically played game and may not be in attendance at the game site. This includes pregame and postgame activities.

I acknowledge receipt of a copy of the CCLL Disciplinary policy and have discussed its content with all coaches and players. I agree to abide by this policy and understand that unacceptable behavior will not be tolerated.
