



Rules for Boys 50/70 Intermediate

Intermediate Division baseball is open to players who are Little League age 11 to 13. Pitching mound distance is 50 feet; bases are 70 feet

Teams will have 2 minutes in between innings to be ready defensively and offensively.

At the 1 hour and 20 minute mark, the umpire will determine the last inning. For example, you are currently in the 4th inning, the 5th inning would be the last inning and thus unlimited runs.

On school nights games should last 1 hour and 45 minutes maximum, however an additional 10 minutes will be added if currently in the unlimited runs inning to encourage finishing the game. Therefore, the drop dead would then be at 1 hour and 55 minutes. No time limit will be imposed after the school season is complete.

Teams may use a courtesy runner for the catcher with 2 outs. The runner should either be a player currently not in the field or the last out if no other available player.

Three coaches in the dugout during games. Coaches will be rostered like players and must pass a background screening. One score keeper and they must remain outside the fence at all time.

Only the manager may contest any calls with the head umpire during the games. Any person that has any contact with the umpire will immediately be removed from the park and serve a three-game suspension.

Manager is responsible for the conduct of the parents and spectators on their side of the field.

Any parent that enters the field of play (inside the fence) will be immediately removed from the park and banned for the rest of the season. The team that the parent is from will forfeit the game.

All Pitch counts for rec/travel must be reported by 10pm Sunday Night. If counts are not reported it is assumed the player has maxed out their pitch count for the following week.

The ball is live on third dropped strike

There are no fake bunts. Batter will be called out

The infield fly rule is in effect a fly ball is a fair fly ball (not including a line drive nor an attempted bunt) which can be caught by an infielder with ordinary effort, when first & second, or first, second & third bases are occupied, before there are two outs, The Pitcher, catcher & any outfielder stationed in the infield on the play shall be considered infielders for the purpose of this rule. When it seems apparent that a batted ball will be an infield fly, the umpire shall immediately declare INFIELD FLY for the benefit of the runners, if the ball is near the baseline, the umpire shall declare INFIELD FLY IF FAIR the ball is alive and runners may advance at the risk of that ball being caught, or retouch and advance after the ball is touched, the same on any flyball. If the hit becomes a foul ball, it is treated the same as any foul.

There is no head first sliding. One warning and then the runner will be called out

Stealing bases (at any time) and leading off is allowed

All teams will roster bat the batting order

Home team will occupy the First Base Dug Out.... Visiting team will occupy the third base dugout

5 run limit per inning, unlimited runs in the last inning

10 run rule after 4 innings

If a team is short players they may be borrowed from another team. Guest players cannot pitch or play infield and must bat last

3 Attempts per inning to take home on a passed ball

Little League pitching rules

Pitcher must be removed if they hit 3 batters in an inning, 4 batters in a game.

1 – 20 Pitches 0 calendar days (may pitch following day)

21 – 35 Pitches 1 calendar day of rest (cannot pitch next day)

36 – 50 Pitches 2 calendar days of rest (cannot pitch next two days following game)

51 – 65 Pitches 3 calendar days of rest (cannot pitch next three days following game)

66 or More Pitches 4 calendar days of rest (cannot pitch next four days following game)

If a pitcher reaches a day's of rest threshold while facing a batter, the pitcher may continue to pitch until the batter reaches base, is retired, or the third out is made. The pitcher will only be required to observe the calendar days of rest for the threshold that was reached during that at-bat if removed from the mound prior to facing the next batter.

Max pitches per day, 6-8 years old 50 pitches, 9-10 years old 75 pitches, 11-12 years old 85 pitches

NEW FOR 2025 – If a player pitches Saturday, they can pitch Wednesday up to 35 pitches. If player pitches Sunday, they can pitch Thursday up to 35 pitches

If a player catches in 4 or more innings they are not eligible to pitch on that calendar day.

If a player delivers 41 or more pitches in a game they cannot play the position of catcher for the remainder of that day.

A pitcher can finish a batter if their pitch count is reached.

Under no circumstance shall a player pitch in three (3) consecutive days.

When playing outside communities there will be a zero tolerance of player and or manager misbehaviors. Any infractions/altercations/tizzies will be delt with by the board in a swift manner.

BOTH TEAMS NEED TO MAKE SURE THE DUGOUT, FIELD AND SPECTATOR AREA IS CLEANED UP AFTER EACH GAME
