## Parent and Volunteer Code of Conduct

By participating in the Scarborough Little League Baseball or Softball Program — including practices, scrimmages, regular season games, tournaments, and other team activities — parents, guardians, family members, coaches, and managers agree to abide by this Code of Conduct.

Any violation of this Code may result in disciplinary action, including suspension, expulsion, or other measures deemed appropriate by the Scarborough Little League President and Board of Directors.

### Scarborough Little League Families and Volunteers Guidelines:

- 1. Model Positive Behavior**  
Are expected to maintain appropriate levels of behavior as an example to players.
- 2. Stay Accountable**  
Are accountable for their behavior during any activity involving players, including practices, games, and team gatherings.
- 3. No Smoking or Alcohol Allowed**  
Are not permitted to smoke or consume alcohol in the presence of players before, during, or immediately after practices or games, either at the field or in the parking lot.
- 4. Use Respectful Language**  
Do not use foul language toward players, coaches, officials, parents, or fans.
- 5. Demonstrate Self-Control**  
Show restraint and do not exhibit uncontrolled temper before, during, or following game competition.
- 6. Show Respect for Coaches, Umpires, and Players**  
Shall show respect to coaches, umpires, and players at all times.

If a parent wishes to discuss their player's participation, they must do so respectfully and at an appropriate time, outside of practices or games. Meetings should occur privately and not on the field or in the parking lot. Coaches will make every effort to address concerns within 24 hours or at a mutually agreed-upon time.

- 7. Maintain Appropriate Conduct During Games**  
Shall not behave in a loud or inappropriate manner that draws attention away from the game.

Verbally criticizing officials, coaches, parents, or players in a manner that allows others to overhear is highly inappropriate.

- 8. Support the Spirit of the Game**  
Shall not blame the outcome of the game on officials, coaches, or individual players.
- 9. Represent the Team and League with Integrity**  
Volunteers and parents must act in a manner that reflects positively on their team and the league, at all times and in all aspects of their lives, as it pertains to the league and our players.
