

Parents Before the Game:

1. Make a commitment to Honor the Game in action and language no matter what others may do.
2. Tell your children before each game that you are proud of them regardless of how well they play.
3. Arrive at least 15 minutes before game time. Coaches need this to prepare a line-up.

During the Game:

1. Fill your children's "Emotional Tanks."
2. No parents or siblings on the field or in the dugout during warm-ups or during the game. (Little league Mandate)
3. No food in the dugout.
4. Don't yell instructions during the game. Let coaches coach.
5. Cheer good plays by both teams.
6. Mention good calls by the umpires to other parents.
7. If an umpire makes a "bad" call against your team, Honor the Game — be silent!
8. If other parents yell at the umpires, gently remind them to Honor the Game.
9. Don't do anything in the heat of the moment that you will regret after the game. Ask yourself, "Will this embarrass my child or the team?"
10. Remember to have fun! Enjoy the game.



After the Game:

1. Thank the umpires for doing a difficult job for little pay.
2. Thank the volunteer coaches for their commitment and effort.
3. Remind your children again that you are proud of them — win or lose.
