
Opening Day

FHRC Nominee Wins Mid-Atlantic Recreation & Parks' Sports Alliance "Good Sports Award"

Julia Heim, a current player on an FHRC U-13 girl's in-house soccer team in the Northern Region Soccer League was the Harford County recipient of the Mid-Atlantic Recreation & Parks' Sports Alliance "Good Sports Award" for 2008. Michael Busch, Speaker of the Maryland House of Representatives, and Al Hardin, President of the Mid-Atlantic Recreation and Parks' Sports Alliance, presented the award.

The purpose of the "Alliance" is to develop and communicate a Good Sports message throughout the Mid-Atlantic Region that encourages organizations and their players, coaches and spectators to conduct themselves in a manner that promotes a Good Sports environment that keeps recreational sports activities in proper perspective. The purpose of the award is to recognize youth sports participants who truly embody the qualities of good sportsmanship. Every year, Recreation Councils in Harford County are asked to nominate individuals who compete honorably.

Julia is 12 years old and attends Bel Air Middle School. She is an honor student who plays guitar and violin in the school orchestra. She also plays recreation basketball in the Forest Hill/Hickory/Churchville in-house league.

In nominating Julia, Ken Barnes stated, "Though Julia no longer plays softball, I have coached her in all three of the previously mentioned sports. She is a pleasure and an honor to have on my team. She is the consummate, dedicated teammate who helps those in need. She does not miss practices or games, even though she has had a rough few years with her parents separating and the tragic and sudden loss of her mother this year. Julia was also active in Girl Scouts until her mother passed away.

Julia leads through example and never wants to come out of a game. When she does, she never complains, just politely asks when she will go back in. She understands the fundamentals of in-house recreation sports, knowing that all get fair playing time and she accepts her role on the team, never uttering a cross word. She is one of the most coach-able girls I have had the honor to coach and I have very much enjoyed watching her progress as an athlete and young lady."

Men's Over-30 Softball

The Forest Hill Men's Over-30 Softball League is now taking individual registrations for the 2009 summer season. Games are played on Friday evenings at 6:00 PM beginning July 10, 2009. The season wraps up with a championship tournament in mid to late September. All games are played at the Forest Hill Recreation Complex. Because of the number of available fields, the league must be limited to 8 teams and approximately 120 players. General registration for new players begins April 26th. This has become a popular league

and there are a limited number of openings for new players. All are welcome. The league's primary emphasis is fun and friendship through slow-pitch softball. Registration is \$30.00 per player plus uniform and continues through May 26th on a first-come/first served basis until the league is filled. Fall Baseball

This fall, Forest Hill Baseball is participating in both the Baltimore County Major League (BCML) Travel program AND the North Harford Fall Baseball League (NHFBL). All kids currently ages 8 to 14 who will be at least 9 and not more than 15 years old by April 30, 2010 are invited to sign up for Forest Hill Fall Baseball.


The NHFBL in-house program will have teams in the 9-10, 11-12 and 13-14 age groups. Players for this league will be placed on a team based on the age group the child will play in 2010 to give them a chance to prepare for next year. Try-outs are not necessary for participation in the in-house program! This is a register-and-play league, based on availability and number of teams.

The BCML Travel program will also have teams in the 9-10, 11-12 and 13-14 age groups, but this is a competitive league and teams will be selected by competitive try-outs. Players for this league are invited to try-out for the age group based on what the child played in 2009. Because of its competitive nature, playing up in this league is not permitted except for extremely special cases.

No registration is necessary for BCML Travel try-outs, just show up with your glove and bat. In order to qualify for selection, players must make at least one try-out, and it is recommended that players attend as many try-out sessions as they can. Try-outs will only be held in mid-July.

Fees are to be determined. Please watch the Forest Hill baseball website for forms, dates and times. Players will also be notified for Fall Baseball registration during their in-house baseball games at Forest Hill. Hint: It would be wise to sign up for the in-house program and then try-out for the Travel team. That way, the child will be on a team this fall even if he doesn't make the travel team. Any fees paid toward in-house will be transferred to Travel if he makes the team.

Fall Baseball runs from August through October. Games are played on Sunday afternoons. For more information, contact Chris Benjes 410-893-6456, cbenjes@comcast.net.

Second, the cost of printing and postage for the current newsletter is more than \$6,600 a year – money that can be used elsewhere to support recreation programs and activities.




New for the summer of 2009: We are excited to announce the introduction of summer dance camps.

Improvements to the Program

We devote a significant amount of our program's resources to the upkeep of our fields. This spring, we fertilized the field at Friends Park to maintain a high-quality field surface. Additionally, we intend to begin improving the conditions of the fields at Blake's Venture, where many travel teams play and practice. The Forest Hill Recreation Council has arranged to have public water run to the Blakes Venture Complex, which will allow us to re-sod those fields over time. Lastly, we will be re-sodding several of the goal boxes on the fields at the rec. complex. This continued focus on our fields will improve the quality of our program and maintain the appearance that all of us expect.

Last season, we installed portable goals at all of the fields at the recreation complex. The addition of portable goals have provided us with increased flexibility to the sports programs by allowing several sports programs to more easily share field space.

All of these improvements are funded with your registration fees and generous support from our annual fundraiser. Thanks for all that you do to make our program one of the best in the county.

Force Travel Soccer

The Forest Hill soccer program also offers travel soccer teams for players who are interested in playing at a higher level. The Force travel soccer program promotes growth and appreciation for the game of soccer by providing an environment where individuals can:

- Further develop their skills and understanding of the game;
- Learn leadership, teamwork, and sportsmanship;
- Develop physical fitness and mental awareness;
- Encourage courtesy, proper conduct and respect for players, officials, coaches and spectators;
- Create an atmosphere that inspires fun, growth and learning, while developing new friendships, and encouraging support in the community.

The travel soccer program includes boys and girls teams from U8 thru U16. These teams typically practice twice a week starting around the first week in July and will have games on Saturday and/or Sunday beginning in September. They also participate in two or more weekend tournaments during the fall season.

Tryouts for the Force travel soccer teams begin around June 1st and you should contact the coach appropriate for your age group if you are interested in attending tryouts. Coaches' contact information can be found at www.foresthillrec.com.
